

We extend a warm East Kent welcome to Charlton Park RFC who have travelled down from SE3 8NB and we hope they enjoy the afternoon and our hospitality and then experience some attractive Rugby. At the time of writing this article it looks like the pitches will have drained enough to provide a suitable surface for a good game

This Counties 1 Kent League game sees Charlton Park currently in 12th position, two places below Thanet. Our last encounter away to them in December saw a 41-17 defeat and Thanet had a torrid time, which has since seen a bit of a reversal with Thanet playing some of their best rugby of their season in their last 6 games, including a fantastic 43-13 win against Deal and Betteshanger , when total Rugby was played in all quarters with the young backs coming into their element. Today's 1st Team match official is Isaac Fortnall, while Graeme Ludley officiates the 2nd XV against Canterbury and Freya Simpson takes control of the 3Rd XV also against Canterbury. We wish them all a warm welcome to St. Peters and hope for open, injury free games played in the spirit of Rugby.

Tomorrow morning's games see the U12s and U13s at home and in their league the U16s entertainCanterbury in what is always a lively affair. In the afternoon the Ladies 1st XV play Westcliff in a NC2 South East (East) fixture.

You may have seen a gentleman rattling his charity bucket along our touchline over the last 10 years. Well may I introduce you to John Corrigan, a truly remarkable person (Deeds Not Words!)

John and his bucket have raised over £ 31,205 for the RFU Injured Players Foundation £3,410 from the touchline at St Peters. This is even more remarkable when you consider that John never played ruby. He is a cyclist and

has used this sport to raise sponsorship for the RFU Injured Players Foundation. John has ridden with Sir Chris Hoy, Sean Kelly, Chris Boardman & Mark Cavendish

He has competed in the Paris-Roubaix (257 km) and the Liege-Bastogne-Liege (260km) and many other races and has raised an outstanding amount of money on his own, for a well worth cause. Thanet Wanderers RUFC 41 – 13 Deal & Betteshanger RFC

Best display of the season so far lifts Wanderers out of the relegation zone.

Wanderers were pleased to have Gabe Haydon available again at hooker and joint skipper Nick Herbert made his first appearance in 2024 at inside centre with Marius Thompson returning at full-back. Sadly Marius was injured in the opening minutes of the game and could not return to the field. He was replaced by Louis Marshall in a reshuffled backline. Connor Brown was back on the bench for only his second outing of the season. Before this game, Deal and Betteshanger Lions were in a comfortable eighth position in Counties One Kent League with Wanderers in an uncomfortable eleventh of twelve.

In his programme notes, Head Coach Elliot Blackmore had recorded that the squad intended to win this match and that determination was evident as his side kicked off down the slope into a stiff breeze. Sharp handling took the ball first right and then back left before a big scrum was won and Tom Walton took the short side and made metres before handing on to Lewis Downer to confidently finish off wide left. Walton's excellent conversion established a 7-0 lead. Deal used the strong breeze to set a platform in Thanet's half and converted a penalty to narrow the gap to 7-3 after fifteen minutes. Five minutes later. Connor Brown was introduced from the bench as Dennis Davies took a break. Great work from Thanet's pack, aided Brown and he was unstoppable on his way to the line for Thanet's second try. Walton's conversion attempt was just wide but Wanderers led 12-3. The Lions fought hard to stop the game from getting away from them and after a patient build up were rewarded with a converted try under the posts with 30 minutes played. Wanderers were quickly back on the attack when Walton's penalty set a good attacking position for the textbook try that followed. Quick ball from a good line-out went directly to Henry Mirams at outside centre who ran an excellent line to touch down. Walton's conversion flew high over the posts and Thanet's lead was restored to 19-10. Both sides pushed hard in the 12 minutes remaining of the half but neither could find a further score before the break.

Wanderers had the wind behind them in the second half and immediately set an attack. Walton's penalty gave them a line-out 25 metres out but a too-strong final pass scuppered the flowing movement. A straightforward penalty two minutes later was converted by Walton to extend the lead but Deal soon also converted a penalty to maintain the nine-point difference. With twenty minutes remaining, Thanet's try bonus point was claimed by Haydon who took a tap and go and tore in low to the ground to touch down for his first Wanderers' senior try. Another excellent conversion from Walton made the score 29-13 to Thanet. Four minutes later there was another memorable try from the Wanderers. Brown broke strongly attacking on Deal's right before more top-quality handling sped the ball along the line to Harrison Quittenden on Thanet's right who used his speed to finish a quality try that could not be converted. There was no giving up from the visitors and they now camped in the Wanderers' half causing the home defence to again draw on its deepest well of resistance to keep their line intact. With the clock into injury time, Wanderers broke clear and Walton's long penalty set a line-out in a good attacking position. Haydon's throw was spot on and fittingly, it was joint captain Sam Taylor who emerged with the ball and the utter determination he had displayed throughout the game helped carry him over for Wanderers closing try. Another top-drawer conversion from Walton made the score 41-13. Today's referee, Simon Bingham, had handled this local derby with his customary aplomb and with a Deal player down injured he wisely soon decided enough was enough and blew for full time.

This was a fine performance from Wanderers based on some tigerish defending and some exhilarating attacks. Much of the handling was superb with great distribution from half-backs Walton and Charlie Panteli that regularly sent the backline away. It was good to see Joint Captain Nick Herbert back, his leadership of the backline and resolute defence have been missed. The pack again had a good afternoon, their defence made a major difference to the result. Connor Brown played a major part on his return and his second-row partner, Andy Letts with number eight Brett Scott and blindside forward Warren Riddell-Bloomfield tackled themselves to a standstill. Prop Forwards, Luke Browning, and Mike Whitehead with Danny Clement on from the bench were influential both in the set scrums and open play. Hooker and try scorer, Gabe Haydon was deservedly named as the Wanderers' man of the match award by the opposition players.

Thanet Wanderers Ladies 19 Thurrock 47

Buoyed by their recent victory at Hammersmith & Fulham two weeks ago, Thanet Wanderers were looking to revenge their heavy defeat by Thurrock in November at St Peter's in a top of the table shoot out for the NC2 league.

Nursing some notable injury absences in the guise of try scorer Rachael Austerberry and Thahseen Ali, a reshuffle of the backs saw full back Jess Anderson step into the 13 shirt and the vacancies filled by the accomplished Léonie and Megan Bish.

Once skipper Gee Cordell had elected to work with the elements, it was not long until fly half, Alex White had pumped the ball into the Thurrock 22 and forwards started to apply the pressure. Pick and go phase play from the Thurman-Newell trio of Milly, Ella and Holly ended up with the simple task of scrum half, Maria Castellina dotting down. White converted for 7-0.

Cordell herself then added to the score after scooping the ball up on the half way line and outpacing the cover defence for another converted score and Thanet had raced to a 14-0 lead in as many minutes.

Thurrock - a bigger, longer developed, more experienced side - changed their approach to the game. Their big forwards picking and going from the base and hitting the first channel which was a strategy that

Thanet, as a young side were not equipped to deal with. Thurrock came back with 2 quick tries and all of a sudden it was 14-12 to the hosts.

Some injuries in key areas followed, most notably Ella Thurman-Newell whose damaged knee will see her miss the rest of the season and Thurrock capitalised whilst Thant tried to recover. Three more tries before the half time break saw Thurrock lead 33-14.

The second half saw some shuffling of players, Fleur Moat and Vicky Flower went into the forwards, Megan Bish and Ellie Hunt filled the wings and Chloe Siddall, recent signing from Aylesford made her debut.

A much tighter affair in the second half saw Thurrock add two tries to their tally whilst a training field move saw Izzy Lodge feed Anderson to leave the final score at 47-19.

In the end, despite the scoreline there was not an enormous huge difference between the sides but the experience from the Thurrock line-up saw them run out convincing winners leaving Thanet ladies licking their wounds. But Thanet don't have long as they travel back to Thurrock in the quarter finals of the RFU Junior Cup on Sunday 3rd March 2024.

The weather conditions for this match were not conducive to the good running rugby that had been on display by Thanet the previous week. An interception by Thanet's Lewis Downer in their own half gave Wanderers the lead as he ran in a try under the posts for Tom Walton to kick the two extra points .. A definite lack of consistency and ball retention allowed Cranbrook back into the game to retake the lead with a second converted try just before half time and a 14-12 advantasge. It was a close contest in the mud but Dover take the league points.

The reverse fixture ended in a 22-22 draw after an exciting encounter in November. However, Dover have enjoyed a good series of results and are currently sixth in Counties League One Kent: Wanderers remain in tenth place. For Wanderers, Luke Browning and Kurt Pearson started in the front row with Dennis Davies replacing Connor Brown in the second row. Louis Marshal and Harrison Quittenden were also unavailable and were replaced by Callum Doody at outside centre and Ellis Taylor on the wing. Wanderers played with their shirts inside out to avoid a clash with Dover's shirts which are also blue.

Heavy rain during the hour before kick-off, followed by heavy showers throughout the game, made conditions very difficult but just playable. An early attack by Dover down their left wing was not dealt with by Thanet's defence and a quality conversion from wide out gave the hosts a valuable 7-0 lead after three minutes. Wanderers responded well but a lengthy attack was ended when a penalty allowed Dover to clear to halfway and enjoy a spell of dominance of possession that was well contained by the Wanderers. Two quick penalties and a good nudge from Henry Mirams, at full-back today, set Wanderers on the attack. Winger, Lewis Downer appeared to have touched down after a good chase but was judged to have been just outside the narrow in goal area. Both teams showed great defence and for Wanderers, Mirams was superb as he was peppered by high balls from the hosts. Dover's outside centre had to withdraw through injury and a tap penalty from Nick Herbert took Wanderers close but there was no change to the 7-0 score before halftime.

Dover went down to 14 players after seven minutes of the second period following a vellow card. Wanderers battled hard to get over the line but Dover stood firm and then extended their lead with a try in the right corner and the extras were added with another fine kick to give them a 14-0 lead. Wanderers tight-head, Gully Goodall, was having another good game but had to withdraw following a knock to the head from a stray knee. Wanderers spent long spells camped near to the home line but could not cross it. Eventually, playing with an advantage, fly-half Charlie Panteli's cross-kick was well collected by Downer for him to touch down wide right. Tom Walton's attempted conversion fell agonisingly just short but with around twenty minutes remaining, Thanet were in the match. Dover responded strongly and Callum Doody was shown yellow for a deliberate knock-on. Despite being a man down, Wanderers' defence was not to be breached again. The nearest they came to adding to their score came following a charge down from Mirams but there was no addition to the score before the young referee, Oliver Smith, who had a good afternoon, blew for full time.

The early try that was conceded was an anomaly in an otherwise determined and effective defensive display from the Wanderers. The challenge that difficult conditions presented for both sides and the referee did not prevent them all from producing a watchable game, even when it was nearly impossible to distinguish between the players.

She joins Milly Thurman-Newell in the Kent Women's squad who has been called up for a second season.

Thanet Ladies now finish the season with three home games against Westcliff on March 17th, Ashford on April 14th and Gravesend on April 28th. Three victories, which are entirely possible will see them finish second behind Thurrock in NC2 in their first season at that level.


