

It was also a cause for celebration as the 1XV scored their first win of the Season.

The hangover of the Rugby World Cup has reduced to a memory where the only Englishman in the final was Wayne Barnes (a friend of Gareth Redmond), but if you told me 8 weeks ago that England would reach the Semi Finals as the only Northern Hemisphere side and undefeated, well, I would have taken the bet. As Ireland went into the World Cup as favourites, their route to success was prevented by one of the eventual finalists the "All Blacks" who just grew throughout the Tournament.


READY, SET, MOW.

Thanet Wanderers RUFC 39-31 Cranbrook RFC

Wanderers overcome a poor start to win an incidentpacked match.

Last week's double try scorer, Noah Dann, was not available but there was a welcome return for James Hamilton at eight and centre Adam Harrison. The newcomers at Bromley, Chris Gregory and Leon Doody retained their places and joint skipper Nick Herbert was back after missing that game due to a family event. Cranbrook were bottom of the twelve team Counties, Kent One league with Wanderers in eleventh place after the opening four games.

The match was preceded by a league match for Wanderers Ladies against Cranbrook Ladies that that gave the day a great start as it was won 58-10. At the same time, some of Wanderers' past players were enjoying an excellent lunch in the clubhouse before adding their voices in support of the Wanderers teams. Great to see you, thanks to club president Clive Lewis for organising the gathering.

Cranbrook kicked off with the advantage of the slope and a strong breeze that was blowing towards the corner. Wanderers made an unusually tentative start, conceding two early penalties and four minutes into the match some slack defence eased the visitors' path to the line for a touch down under the posts, to give them a 0-7 lead. A penalty to Thanet from just inside Cranbrook's ten metre line was safely slotted by Tom Walton and Louis Marshall's tackle halted an opposition attack. Wanderers tight-head prop Gully Goodall ran in at pace from near the 22 with Hamilton and Sam Taylor involved in the build up to touch down Wanderers' first try and give them an 8-7 lead after ten minutes. Cranbrook hit back and Wanderers received a team warning followed by a yellow card for hooker Warren Riddell-Bloomfield. Kurt Pearson was the front row replacement with Hamilton taking the yellow card enforced ten minutes break. Cranbrook chose to scrummage the subsequent penalty and went over under the posts to lead 14-8. Walton's penalty attempt was wide before the visitors added another try that went unconverted. Wanderers returned to their full complement as the yellow card expired but a couple of minutes later Cranbrook were celebrating their bonus point fourth try scored within the first thirty minutes. Tom Walton, who was playing

at fullback, limped off with the recurrence of an ankle injury. Danny Clement's long throw at a line-out was well taken by Hamilton who started a move that led to Thanet's second try. Joint Captains, Nick Herbert and Sam Taylor, with Max Rogers, were central to the defence cracking move that ended with Taylor touching down. The conversion from wide right was first class with Marius Thompson kicking. At half-time it was 26-15 to the visitors.

The break revitalised the Wanderers and Thompson led the way when he was on hand to finish some impressive handling to score Wanderers' third try after five minutes following good pressure from Thanet's pack. Thompson converted his own try to narrow the deficit to just four points. Thanet were on a roll and Henry Mirams was unlucky to be penalised for not rolling away when pinned down but more fine handling ended with some close passing between the forwards before Goodall scored his second try that gave Wanderers the lead 27-26. This was extended to 32-26 five minutes later when Herbert's excellent break sliced through the visitors' defence before he was hauled down and more neat handling was required before Taylor touched down wide left for 32-26. It was still anyone's game and after fifteen hotly contested minutes, Cranbrook exploited some uncertainty in defence to cut the home lead to 32-31. A kickable penalty attempt for Wanderers went wide before a further penalty set a line-out and the resulting forward pressure saw the pack drive over with a richly deserved touch down for lock forward Andy Letts. Thompson made an excellent conversion and Wanderers led 39-31. Cranbrook fought hard to gain a further bonus point but Referee Lewis Frank's whistle sounded, after another good shift from the official, and Wanderers had their first win of the season.

This was an important win for the Wanderers founded on a strong second half performance There was some excellent handling throughout the team and fitness levels were good with the match being played at a lively pace throughout. Gully Goodall at tighthead prop had another outstanding game with his powerful scrummaging and strong carries and there was great commitment throughout the team to register their first win.

Thanet Wanderers RUFC ladies XV continued their unbeaten run at the top of National Challenge 2 with a convincing victory over Cranbrook RFC by 58-10.

Playing on a Saturday as part of the club's double header - the men would later beat Cranbrook 39-31 - the ladies were buoyed by a large crowd of ex-players viewing from the sidelines and the balcony. Dominant starts have quickly become a feature of Thanet's game and this was to be no different and after a scrum on the right, swift hands from the backs saw full back Jess Anderson ghost into the space and go over from 30 metres out. It was to be the first of 4 tries for Anderson in an impressive performance in her new position at full back.

The forwards were doing what they do by making dents in the Cranbrook defence and allowing the space to appear out wide when centre, Rachael Austerberry escaped some weak tackling in midfield and scored her 7th try in 3 games.

The Cranbrook forwards were strong and when in possession were making holes in Thanet's defence but there always seemed to be some cover defence which would keep them scoreless at least until half time.

Pack leader, Milly Thurman-Newell broke the line and hobbled over from 30 metres out before leaving the game with a hamstring injury. Léonie Bish stepping in for Alex White at fly half marshalled her resources with aplomb and after Jess Anderson had completed her hat-trick and winger Amy Coster had got her first, Bish added a couple of conversions to open her scoring account for the season. Austerberry then added her second, Coster got her second and the first half ended with Thanet 44-0 ahead.

The second half saw the introduction of more 1st XV debutant players in the form of Tia Perkins and Justine Mackintosh which is a demonstration of how this Thanet Ladies squad is growing. Both applied themselves in the back row and will put their hand up for 1st XV selection again.

With the wind and slope elements in their favour in the second half, Cranbrook came back into the game and having camped themselves in the bottom end of the park twice, came away with 2 tries. But the final word went to Wanderers with Anderson getting her fourth before Kent second row, Georgia Elks got over for the final try, converted by Bish.

The next outing for the Thanet Ladies is a midweek floodlit game at the club on Wednesday 25th October 2023 against Christchurch University before they travel to Ashford for the next round of the Junior Cup at Ashford RFC the following Sunday 29th October 2023.

This is only the beginning of the club's journey and we hope that everyone at the club, whether as a player, coach, parent or spectator will get behind us and help make Thanet Wanderers a welcoming place for ALL.

With this in mind we are introducing some new codes of conduct that you will see highlighted around the club and the grounds. These will explain what is considered good pratice and what will not be tolerated. They will also give details of who you can contact if you have any concerns, issues or need help or support.

We live in a constantly changing society and if we want to play a positive, relevant and meaningful part in our community, both local and our rugby community, we need to adapt and be more accepting of the diverse society that we are all a part of.

The half back pairing of Burns

and 18-year-old Sophie West was formidable and they marshalled their troops around the park with control and direction.

CCCU extended their lead out to 22-7 before the most popular score of the evening saw winger Daisy Osborne get on the end of a sweet move to dot down in the corner, again converted by Burns. 22-14.


Once again CCCU extended their lead out to 30-14 with a well struck penalty and another try in the corner.

Heathfield and Waldron RFC 31 – 19 Thanet Wanderers RUFC

Wanderers have nothing to show for a spirited display in difficult conditions.

There were two new faces in the Thanet squad with a debut for Luke Browning after good performances for the 2s and for Hoani (Aitch) French whose debut was delayed by injury after he moved to the Thanet area. Tom Walton and Marius Thompson were excluded by injury and props Danny Clement and Gully Goodall with lock forward Chris Gregory and three-quarters Louis Thompson and Max Rogers had family commitments. The two debutants brought the total of players who have represented the first XV in the first six games of the season to thirty-six which is not helpful to coaches trying to build continuity within the side or to the 2s who lose players to the senior side.

The playing surface was saturated but just playable although the heavy rain continued to fall during the first half. Mid Sussex based, Heathfield and Waldron (H&W) were quickly into their stride and after a penalty set good field position, opened the scoring under the posts for a 7-0 lead after two minutes, A promising Wanderers attack ended with a penalty conceded for holding on. Number eight, Brett Scott made good metres with a powerful carry and Mike Whitehead was making light of the conditions with good line-out throws. 22 minutes had been played when a well judged interception for H&W gave the catcher an easy run in under the posts from his own half to make the score 14-0 to the hosts. Andy Dolan suffered the recurrence of an injury and was replaced on the wing by Cam Pond. Wanderers mounted some good drives and were playing with an advantage when recalled for a penalty that saw them set a line-out close to the opposition line. The throw in was good and a well managed catch and drive ended with a try for jointcaptain Sam Taylor. Charlie Panteli's conversion attempt was well struck but went wide and Thanet were on the board, after 30 minutes 14-5. Both sides' attacking instincts were undone by the teeming rain but Thanet's lock forward. Lenny Brown revelled in the rain and

pinched an opposition line-out to set a good break. Tom Stevens' tackle forced a knock on and stopped imminent danger but there was no further score for either side before half-time.

Recently a Wanderers Colt, Dennis Davies had played well in his favoured back row position: he took a break at the beginning of the second half and Aitch French joined the mud fest. The rain had relented as the second half began and the hosts leapt high to catch an attempted Thanet clearance before touching down within the first minute of the half. There was no conversion but H&W led 19-5. Six minutes later another interception led to the fourth try and a bonus point for the host side. French was showing good energy in the back row and appeared to have scored but the referee had seen a double movement before touchdown and H&W cleared their lines. Around the hour mark, a brilliantly controlled drive from Thanet's pack ended with a second try for Taylor. Panteli made an excellent conversion for Thanet to trail 26-12. Minutes later more excellent work from the pack saw Mike Whitehead touch down for his maiden first XV try. Another quality conversion from Panteli made the score 26-19. Oskar Wallace came on from the bench but French was shown vellow for a deliberate knock-down and with both props injured, Wanderers had to opt for uncontested scrums. Thanet conceded a final try when a defensive slip helped the hosts to touch down an unconverted try and lead 31-19. Wanderers fought hard for a further try but could not cross the line and there was no further score.

Thanet's pack put in a fine performance today in difficult conditions. Joint Captain, Nick Herbert paid tribute particularly the front five. Warren Riddell-Bloomfield played well, out of position, at hooker and Andy Letts' consistency in the engine room is astounding. The conditions were difficult for the ball handlers of the team but the depleted team put in a performance to be proud of.

Tom Stevens captained a good mix of youth and experience who took on near neighbours Dover in the first round of the Kent RFU Shield trophy.

Dover kicked off and were quickly on the attack but too many penalties punctuated the first quarter of the match as the hosts took time to settle. It was thirty minutes before Dover opened the scoring with a well-struck penalty from around 30 metres. The last kick of the half saw them double their advantage to 6-0 with a second penalty.

Four minutes into the second half, the visitors went over for a try which was converted. Charlie Panteli knocked over a penalty from distance four minutes later to open the Wanderers' account and make it 13-3. Dover were handling well and an unconverted second try followed five minutes later, near the left touchline. Big tackles from Harrison Quittenden and Tom Stevens stopped the deficit from widening further, but first Jake McGee and four minutes later, Stevens, were shown yellow cards reducing Wanderers to thirteen players. Quittenden then seized on a loose ball, deep in his own half, and evaded all attempted tackles to touch down under the posts for a fine individual try. Panteli converted to make the score 18-10. His long-range penalty attempt then fell just short. James Whowell

raised a cheer as he caught well and tore back at the opposition but the visitors were undaunted and hit back with an unconverted try. Finally, back to full strength, Wanderers showed some top-quality handling before Stevens touched down for Panteli to convert. Thank you to referee Lewis Franks for his usual calm officiating of a potentially fiery encounter: but now, his whistle soon sounded for full-time and snuffed out any hope for Thanet who had lost 23-17.

It was good to see Antony Theodosiou approaching a return to full fitness as he repeatedly broke the opposition line and Harrison Quittenden celebrated his return to competition with a nice try and a solid all-round performance. Reagan Doody did well in his first game of the season and Warren Riddell-Bloomfield put in another good performance in the unfamiliar role of hooker. Good luck to Dover for the next round of the Shield, Wanderers will now be in the plate competition.

Thanet Wanderers 22 v Cranbrook 12

On Sunday the 22nd October TWRUFC Colts headed up to Cranbrook with a mixed development team on a sunny autumnal day. This reporter back from journalistic exile with the hope the club and older opposition player's mothers will take feedback on their precious babies. Twenty players made the hour-long journey along pleasant English country roads with the same number of coaches and supporters all hoping that finding the 'key to success' against Cranbrook will be easier than actually finding the clubhouse.

Thanet won the toss and elected to kick off with Isaac Devine at flyhalf sending the ball skyward into the Cranbrook half of the field.
