PRESIDENT'S ADDRESS

We welcome today the players and coaches from our near neighbours Folkestone who will no doubt be joined on the short journey by a good number of supporters and club officials. You are very welcome ladies and gentlemen; I hope we shall see an entertaining match without serious injury to the players.

We travelled to Folkestone for the reverse fixture on the 5th of November on a wet and chilly afternoon and before the game were glad to take shelter in the hosts' modern warm clubhouse, adjoining some of the channel tunnel infrastructure. The club's path first crossed with the Anglo-French enterprise when the construction was in its infancy and the club found itself displaced from its recently completed ground and clubhouse near the A20. After years of sweat and tears spent fundraising and with many putting their skills to work on the construction, this must have been a body blow for the club. A compulsory purchase order valued the clubhouse and grounds at much less than their true value and to add insult to injury lawyers claimed that because of its quite recent arrival, the club was not entitled to reinstatement. David took on and defeated that particular Goliath and it's good to report that the Channel Tunnel Group, after their early intransigence, did a volte-face and became supportive and helpful partners. The club was able to use the old clubhouse and grounds until the bulldozers were waiting at the gates and that helped made the building of the new club a more straightforward operation. Channel Tunnel Group were signed up as a club sponsor and also paid for the opening ceremony before making generous donations over the first years on the new clubhouse and grounds. The new complex was opened in September 1989 and the Club will celebrate fifty years at the heart of the local Community next year.

The viewing balcony was a popular spot in November as the pitch side was much less inviting as the rain intensified throughout the match. Three first-half tries from Andy Dolan, Neil Wakefield and Jack Startin with a couple of conversions from Tom Walton gave Wanderers a 19-0 lead at half time but they couldn't find another for a try bonus point in the second half when the hosts scored an unconverted try in second half added time. Both sides have won just twice since

although Folkestone have had the much closer results which makes last Saturday's loss by 72-0 at Bromley a surprising one. Wanderers have generally been playing well without much to show for it since Christmas but this is clearly an important fixture for both sides as the remaining fixtures begin to run out. Our 3s are also due to play away against Folkestone 3s who have yet to win a game this season. We are currently in second place behind Canterbury Zingari who were defeated 18-17 a couple of weeks ago when Wanderers' Director of Rugby Neil Roby was delighted to nail a crucial kick to win the game following Canterbury's excessive celebrations after taking the lead minutes earlier. The 2s are at home today against Medway's very useful 4th XV who won a close, reverse fixture 28-26.

Two good matches are on offer today then at St Peters and we are home again next Saturday against Crowborough when we will also be entertaining our sponsors at their annual lunch. Wanderers supporters, if you haven't already reserved your seat, please consider what our generous sponsors bring to all sections within the club and do come along to thank them and show what an inclusive and social club we can be. The menu is good with a soup followed by mushroom chicken, cheesecake and of course, cheese and biscuits. I understand that the committee will introduce the club's three-year plan with an outline of improvements planned for the future during lunch. FROM THE HEAD COACH

We started the season with such high hopes of being in the mix at the other end of the table to where we currently find ourselves. From the solid performance we put in against Canterbury seconds in our warm up game, who are now flying high in Counties 2 and the narrow defeat to currently 6th placed Ashford way back in September, we now find ourselves slugging it out to survive in Counties One. Folkestone sit one point and place above us despite winning one less game than us this season as they have collected valuable bonus points along the way. The try bonus point we picked up last weekend against Cranbrook although valuable was less than we should have got having led 17-0 after 20 minutes. Our only point in 2023 so far, we know that points today against our closest relegation rivals are vital. Our game in hand is a tough one away to 5th placed Heathfield & Waldron and our two remaining home games against 11th placed Crowborough and on the last day of the season, Ashford, are targeted as winnable. Our only other remaining game is away to bottom of the table Aylesford, who may well be relegated by then and be another possible win. With 8th place Deal already 22 points above us our best hope is for a 9th place finish to just keep above the relegation zone that is likely to be the bottom three clubs. Folkestone will of course have targeted this game as a must win game for them so I predict a hard fought bruising battle.

Last week there were real signs at times that we had the firepower to stay in this league as we continue to rebuild and bring in young players from our junior section. And although 5 straight defeats in 2023 so far may not


sound good, the team has shown great spirit and been competitive in every match. Again this week we have had to juggle things around but the return of skipper Nick Herbert at 10, as well as props Dan Clement and Gulliver Goodall and the experienced big ball carrying number 8 Lenny Brown, the team has a robust look about it today. Sport as we know is a strange thing and of course it's all on the day and hope that the game lives up to its billing. All the lads have been training hard, with great numbers through January and the milder weather certainly has helped. Kieran Hopper has joined the coaching team. He hopes to stay with us next season and complete his level 3 coaching badge. A young but already quite experienced coach he also works for Saracens in their development programme and hopes to go onto being a professional rugby coach. The lads have enjoyed the sessions he has delivered so far and we look forward to him becoming even more involved next season. Elliot, Gareth, Mike and Bill continue to offer their massive wealth of experience in developing the squad.

Later in the clubhouse we have the always popular Horse racing event. For those that have never experienced a Wanderers Race Night, the 6 horses are auctioned and named by their owners. Races are run using coloured and numbered dice to advance the different coloured horses down a variety of race tracks from a straight sprint to the Grand National with fences and handicaps. It's an exciting couple of hours where you could well go home a lot better off than you arrived!! Everyone is more than welcome to join in.

MATCH REPORT

Thanet Wanderers RUFC 24 – 40 Cranbrook RFC

Four tries and a bonus point for the Wanderers after another battling performance.

Skipper Nick Herbert and scrum-half Tom Walton were not available for this game, they were replaced by Adam Harrison and Callum Doody with Henry Mirams back in the centre. Harry Clemo sustained a rib injury last week and was replaced by Mike Morris with Kurt Pearson back as hooker.

It was good to see Kieran Wright back in the squad and Warren Riddell-Bloomfield as captain for the day.

Wanderers were quickly into their stride playing down the slope and soon drew a penalty. The resulting line-out and drive ended with Kurt Pearson touching down wide left. Marius Thompson's conversion attempt went left of the posts. Cranbrook reacted with a sustained attack but were penalised and Thompson's long clearance took play to halfway. Thanet went further ahead after fifteen minutes when an interception put Henry Mirams away and his well-judged pass released Louis Marshall to score his second try of the season against Cranbrook. Thompson's conversion put Wanderers into a 12-0 lead. Wanderers mounted another attack, after taking a scrum against the head and drew a penalty. Cranbrook knocked on at the line-out and Connor Brown's pick-up from the resulting scrum led to a forwards' drive. Loosehead prop, Michael Morris, enhanced a good performance with his first, first team, try. Thompson's attempted conversion was just wide but Wanderers were 17 points clear. The visitors hit back hard and an attempted fly-hack clearance led to a Cranbrook attack and a converted try. A team warning had been issued and it was Pearson who was shown the card and 'took one for the team'. The visitors produced some inspired handling for a second converted try but Wanderers defended well in the run-up to halftime when they led 17-14.

Mike Whitehead replaced Joe Carlier in the front row at the start of the second half. Wanderers were conceding

too many penalties and again received a yellow card warning from today's excellent referee, Ben Johnston. Cranbrook's big runners were kept out but a series of pick-and-goes could not be kept out and the visitors went ahead 17-21. Wanderers showed great spirit to battle back and after some slick handling from the backline was stopped just short of the line Wanderers pack initiated their own series of pick-and-goes. As they moved to midfield the visiting defence moved left and there was a big enough gap for lock forward, Andy Letts, to gallop through for his second try in successive weeks. Thompson added the extras and Wanderers were ahead 24-21. Another fine handling movement looked promising but when it broke down Cranbrook showed some assured handling to burst through the home defence to run in under the posts for a 24-28 lead. Wanderers defence was sound against another battering and produced a dominant scrum that gained many metres before being halted. The contest intensified and Marshall and Noah Dann snuffed out attacks with excellent tackles before Cranbrook built from deep and burst through for their fifth try. The visitors' number 5 was shown yellow with minutes remaining but that didn't stop their outstanding full back who ran from near his goal line to score a converted try. The game fizzled out with the restart not reaching the ten-metre line before the final whistle blew for a final score of 40-24.

Wanderers will take heart from their third try bonus point and look forward to next Saturday's home match against Folkestone who are one point ahead of Wanderers in Counties One - Kent League.

Kick Off is at 2.30 PM at St Peters Rec.

Today's man of the match was Louis Marshall who put in his usual wholehearted display, scored a try, tackled himself to a standstill and finished, as he started, with a smile on his face.

As a club Thanet Wanderers is committed to improving all aspects of equality, inclusion and diversity within the club. MATCH REPORT

Thanet Wanderers Ladies v Faversham Ladies (away).

Thanet Wanderers Ladies XV, protecting a 100% Inner Warrior league record travelled to Faversham on Sunday for the return league match.

Having won the home game 89-5 earlier in the season, coach Ian Lodge took the opportunity to rest 8 senior players and give some less experienced players some valuable game time.

With three 17 year olds and 8 other players with less than half a dozen games under their belt, the young squad took to the field and started strongly.

Fleur Moat opened the scoring after 10 minutes with a trademark smash up the middle, reaching out for the line for her 5 pointer.

But it was full back and player of the match, Megan Bish who gained the plaudits with a first half scamper into the right corner. She soon followed that by outpacing the defenders on the left before completing her hat-trick, then grab her fourth and then put Ellie Hunt in for her first for the club.

Faversham had asked for no conversions so Wanderers raced to a 30-0 lead in as many minutes.

But Faversham were defending solidly and knocking the Wanderers players back with dominant tackles. Up front was combative in nature with the Faversham pack involved in an arm wrestle with their Thanet counterparts. Captain, Brioni Reah standing out with her trademark robust tackling.

Although relatively inexperienced, these ladies understand the structure set out in the Ladies XV and the use of space in the wide channels was where their efforts were going to bear fruit.

One of the 17 year olds, Sophie West had started the match at scrum half but a slight knock saw her replaced with Gee Cordell who made an immediate impact with a trademark try before putting in winger Amy Coster for her first try in only her third ever game of rugby.

Half time saw a 35-0 lead as well as a request from Faversham to withdraw Cordell from the team for 20 minutes to allow a fairer battle. We duly obliged given the lead.

But this Wanderers team, now with 9 players rested still have pace, power and skill all over the park.

With West back on the pitch, it was now over to the other 17 year olds to get in on the action, two from winger, Tilia Elliston and one from stand-in stand-off, Izzy Lodge.

Lucy Challenger then took her opportunity playing out of position in the centre, first with a finish from 40 yards out and then after a jackal in her own 22 went the length of the pitch to stretch the lead out to a 60-0 lead.

The scoring finished with fly half, Léonie Bish going over before Cordell, now allowed back on the pitch but now as a hooker, made a break and fed centre Sophia Richardson to complete the scoring at 70-0.

Although the scoreline might not look that way, this was a vastly improved Faversham side with the real differences between the sides being the working through the phases creating line breaks.

Wanderers now have a week off before matches on the next 8 Sundays starting with Sheppey at home on 19th February and culminating with a visit from Chelmsford on 9th April.

In between that the Ladies XV will be testing themselves against NC2 opposition (2 leagues higher) in the shape of Dartford Valley, Cranbrook and New Ash Green, a level that Thanet could be competing in if we can get agreement from the RFU.


