That's £ 170 even before we've kicked off!!!!!! So please support your Club by attending the above event.



# MATCH REPORT

#### **OLD ALLEYNIANS 24 THANET WANDERERS 25**

This was a hard fought game with neither side able to sustain a period of consistent possession throughout. The home side were quick to start with an early try. Thanet responded from the restart and were soon deep in the opposition's 22 and driving towards the line when they were awarded a penalty try as Alleynians were deemed to have pulled the maul down. Alleynians were also reduced to 14 men as they received a yellow card for the infringement which took Thanet into the lead after 6 minutes. 5-7. Although unable to capitalise on the extra man for the 10 minutes, Thanet did make a couple of breaks for the line and were also held up once. As Thanet continued to apply pressure. a charge down in the nineteenth minute saw Thanet extend the lead with their second try of the game from Dennis Davies.

Alleynians then enjoyed a period of possession but were unable to make this count with the visitors staying solid in defence and at one point returning down the path to again be held up across the line. Just before the half time whistle, Alleynians made a quick break up the field and, with good handling, scored a converted try, to even the scores at 12 all.

The hosts started the second half quickly and drove Thanet off the ball to score a try within 2 minutes of the restart and lead 17-12 as it was not converted. Thanet then maintained some possession and completed a move up the pitch to score another try by Finley Hickmott and draw level again at 17-17. The last half hour of the match was set up to be a tight contest with both teams striving for the win and a possible bonus point.

Alleynians were the first to break the deadlock with a try under the posts that was easily converted after 55 minutes 24-17. There was then a period of a midfield battle with Wanderers trying to keep possession and the home team determined to maintain the lead. On 66 minutes a penalty from Lewis Downer made it 24-20 but it took until the 74th minute for them to break the line again as Downer grounded the ball for the bonus point try. Although Alleynians pushed hard in the last minutes of the game they were unable to pierce Wanderers' defence. Thanet took 5 league points from a hard fought game with both sides contributing to a well played match.

Wanderers Coaches' choice as their man of the match was Finley Hickmott who has broken into the first XV this season and continued his excellent start with a try and another good all round performance in the back row. There is no match or the first XV this coming Saturday; they will return to league action with a home fixture against Aylesford Bulls on the 9th of November when the kick off time will be at the new time of 2PM.

## MATCH REPORT

#### THANET WANDERERS RUFC 30 - 20 MEDWAY RFC 2S

Wanderers retain second place in the league after a hard-earned, bonus point, victory.

There were first starts for Dominick Springer at tight head prop and Finley Hickmott at six. Ben Cannon started at number 8 and Dennis Davies was back in the second row. Henry Mirams returned to play in the centre with Callum Doody filling the fullback spot. Wanderers started the match in second place in Kent 2 with Medway in fifth place.

The morning's rain had gone leaving a pleasant afternoon and a good playing surface as Wanderers kicked off up the slope. Left wing, Harrison Quittenden used his exceptional speed to chase and then leap above the visitors' defence to secure possession and set Wanderers on the front foot. The pressure was maintained, Thanet's pack was unstoppable and Mike Whitehead claimed the touchdown within a couple of minutes. Back surged Medway and on five minutes, despite a superb tackle from Doody, their forwards were celebrating a converted try and a 7-5 lead. Cannon was clearly enjoying his No 8 role and on nine minutes there was no stopping him as he sped over after some quality handling in the build-up.. The 10-7 lead was short-lived as three minutes later Medway's kicker slotted a penalty from near the home ten-metre line. Wanderers were showing great enterprise in attack but over ambition saw opportunities missed. Medway went ahead with a straightforward penalty after 27 minutes. With around five minutes of the half remaining, a quality build-up from Thanet followed by a lovely combination between Lewis Downer and Ben Cannon ended with the number 8 weaving through for his second try. There was no conversion but the Wanderers led 15-13 at the break.

Wanderers again made a fast start to a half when Cannon picked up near the line and tacked his way across the field before touching

down near the posts for a try to complete a brilliant hat-trick. Downer's conversion made it 22-13. Andrew Dolan had joined from the bench at halftime but soon returned there for ten minutes, following a yellow card. Downer now converted a penalty to stretch the home advantage to 25-13. Louis Marshall was on the wing today and spotted a gap before dodging and speeding his way to the line for a fine individual try to give Thanet a 30-13 lead with half an hour remaining. The visitors reduced the margin by seven points with 15 minutes remaining to raise their hopes of bonus points. Thanet's defence stayed strong and Adam Harrison's long clearances were of great value. Downer took a knock and was replaced by Charlie Panteli, home from Uni for the weekend. A very kickable penalty opportunity was not taken in favour of a set move but there was no further score and Wanderers took the win

Lots of quality performances throughout a side who were stingy in defence and lively in attack today; so there were many candidates for Thanet coaches to choose as their man of the match. It was a joint award to outside centre, Henry Mirams and his wing partner, Louis Marshall who combined so well in attack and defence. Wanderers remain unbeaten in second place having won five and drawn one of their six games.

# MATCH REPORT

#### THANET WANDERERS U15S VS ASHFORD U15S

3rd November at Ashford Rugby Club. Sunday the 3rd brought perfect conditions for Thanet U15s visit to Ashford to play the second of their league matches of the season. Thanet's first match saw them win at home to Dover and so they stood as the league leaders going into this match.

The games between these two teams are always close and another tough battle was expected. Thanet won the toss and kicked off and the first 10 minutes of the match were a tough forward battle with good rucking and counter rucking by both sides. Most of the play was held in the Ashford half as much of the first half action continued to be. The work the forwards had been doing during their Wednesday training sessions was really paying off and a series of very strong runs, particularly by the Thanet back row of Patrick Gartrell, George Saunders and Nye Potter, was causing Ashford to dig deep defensively.

After 18 minutes the pressure became too much when from an Ashford put in the ball squirted out and was picked up by Nye Potter who charged through to the 10-metre line. Ashford regained possession but the clearance kick was charged down by Marshall Hughes and a good bounce found the ball bouncing into the hands of Dexter Sproates who ran in for Thanet's first try of the game.

The conversion attempt from the side line was narrowly missed and after another 15 minutes of hard forward exchanges the half time whistle went with Thanet leading a close match 5-0.

Changes were made in the back line with Jack Sperryn coming on in the centre for Andrew Bull, but the pack continued as per its starting line up hoping to maintain their slight dominance at the breakdown.

The second half was underway and Finlay Smith continued his kicking masterclass by continually turning the Ashford defence, making sure the game was being played in their half. The huge defensive effort that Ashford had put in to keep Thanet at bay in the first half seemed to be taking its toll as the fitness levels of the Thanet team started to show. Repeated pick and goes from the Thanet forwards made ground. Dexter Sproat made another breakaway towards the Ashford 22 passing to Noah Manga who was held up over the line. From the resultant scrum the Ashford fly half kicked from

behind his line which was collected by Dexter who then released Tim Wehrly. The ball was secured at the breakdown and Harrison Tickle, the Thanet 9, quickly fed Finlay Smith, who having spotted the space out wide, moved the ball through the centres to James Kebbell who unselfishly put in the Thanet 15, Jamie Barbara who had intelligently joined the attacking line looping in behind his winger. The angle again was a little too much for the conversion attempt and Thanet were now 10-0 up.

The Thanet forwards were now in the ascendance with the Ashford pack starting to tire. An Ashford scrum on their 22 saw good line speed from the Thanet backs shutting down the Ashford centres and from the resultant break down, Nye Potter, who had an immense game at the breakdown, regained possession, Harrison Tickle fed to Finlay Smith who then saw the opening and ran through from 10 metres out to touch down under the posts. This time the conversion was successful, and Thanet now stretched out the lead to 17-0.


The game was now being played almost exclusively in the Ashford 22 and from a Thanet scrum inside their 22, George Saunders picked up from the base of the scrum and broke through two tackles and scored under the posts. Finlay Smith completed his 2nd conversion of the day, and the score now stood at 24-0.

The game was not over however as Ashford fought their way into the Thanet 22 and some very strong forward play by Ashford was beaten off by some determined defence by the Thanet team. The last 5 minutes of the match saw Ashford camped on the Thanet line but a knock on saw Thanet win back possession and the final whistle went with a 24-0 win to Thanet.

As always, the matches played between these two teams are very competitive but always played in a very good spirit. The after-match analysis had this as probably the best all around squad performance that the boys have had to date with those coming off the bench having a real positive effect on the game. Thanet now have 2 friendly games against Bromley and Tonbridge Juddians before their next league match against Gillingham Anchorians on December 15th.
