PRESIDENT'S ADDRESS

Happy New Year to ALL Club players, members, Vice Presidents, spectators, parents and the wider Thanet Wanderers community, and welcome to the second half of the 2025-2026 season.

Today we welcome Folkestone RFC, who are 4th in the League with 37 points, to St Peter's. Thanet are positioned 2nd with 45 points, this after both teams have played 11 games. Folkestone beat Medway 2nd XV last week with a close 24-17 win, and Thanet Wanderers beat Vigo last week 27-10 picking up a try bonus point as well as the points for a win.

This is our first home game since 29th November and in that time, Thanet have had mixed fortunes losing to Aylesford Bulls by a 2-point margin, but picking up a bonus point for tries scored, and denying Aylesford the bonus point by losing by no more than a 5-point margin. Beating Medway by 35 points gained us a bonus point with 6 tries scored, Tom Walton scoring a hat trick and an early Christmas present.

The Aylesford Bulls game was a frustrating one. By half time Aylesford were 26-0 up, but had started to incur 4 Yellow cards, Thanet came back with 4 tries, two converted and a penalty, regrettably too little too late, very similar to last year's game. First half misfortunes were repeated at Vigo last week, and it looks like the old Thanet bug of travelling does not suit us. We need to start with more intensity and hopefully that will be executed today.

For those of you who have joined us for the Winter Warmer lunch today I hope you enjoyed your fayre? We are without Colin Whitely (past President) this season as his health has taken a backward step. Over the festive period he was taken into Hospital, and I visited him earlier this week in QEQM and he was in good spirits and still had his sense of humour. Get better soon Colin.

Thank you to Annemarie for organising the Quiz Night on the 12th December and the Christmas

Hamper raffle. Over £800 was raised for Club funds, this on top of the £700 she raised for Bowl Cancer Charity in November.

Two Internationals

Last year Folkestone fielded two internationals, Seyhan Fell, who has played for Folkestone since he was a youth player has represented Cyprus Rugby on numerous occasions, whilst 18-year-old Cairo Ellis has recently been

selected to play for Jamaica Rugby's U20s.

Seyhan Fell is missing from this year's Stones squad but Thanet Wanderers now have their own Cyprus International with Charlie Panteli

representing Cyprus in Ayia Nappa against

Malta back in November. This now gives us two current Internationals Charlie and Marius Thompson who has represented Norway.

Guinness World Record

Lettsy took part in the longest recorded continuous rugby union game in Dublin in June 2025. The record now stands at 34 hours and 48 minutes. Head Coach's Match Day Notes – 1XV

It's great to be back at the club and into the second half of the season, with plenty still to play for.

From a 1XV perspective, the first part of the campaign has been a real mix of challenge, growth and learning. Results have reflected a group that is developing and evolving. When we've been accurate in the basics, disciplined in our decision-making and connected defensively, we've shown exactly what we're capable of. Where we've fallen short, it has often been about consistency rather than ability.

That's encouraging, because consistency is something we can coach, train and improve together.

1XV Performance Review

There have been strong performances and important lessons taken from every game. We've competed well for long periods, created opportunities and shown real fight as a group. The challenge now is turning those positive passages into full 80-minute performances and making sure our standards don't drop under pressure.

The attitude of the squad has been excellent. Players have responded positively to feedback, taken responsibility for their roles and continued to work hard, even when results haven't gone our way.

Player Development in Action

A major focus this season has been putting clear, meaningful player development structures in place for the 1XV.

We've now launched Player Development Plans (PDPs) across the squad. These are honest, individual conversations that give players clarity on where they are, what they need to improve and how that links directly to team performance. Importantly, they place ownership with the player, supported by the coaching team.

Alongside this, our Coaches' Corner provides a regular opportunity for players to speak openly with coaches outside of training. This has already improved communication, trust and alignment across the squad.

Our training environment has also been refined to better reflect match-day demands. Sessions are competitive, purposeful and focused on decision-making under pressure, ensuring players are prepared for the physical and mental challenges of league rugby.

The Road Ahead

As we move through the second half of the season, the focus is on building momentum, improving consistency and continuing to develop as individuals and as a team. We want players to be confident, accountable and fully committed to the standards we set together.

There is a strong belief within this group, and with the right structures now in place, I'm confident performances and results will continue to move in the right direction.

MATCH REPORT

THANET WANDERERS V OLD ALLEYNIAN'S 2ND XV

29-11-2025

This was not the best start to a game at St Peter's for Thanet as the rain poured down at kick off. Thanet's team were a man down within three minutes of the start as Giotto McCourt-Welsh was shown a yellow card after a number of home side infringements. The visitors did not score from the resulting penalty and were then also deemed to be offside just before they grounded the ball. Wanderers' first real inroad into the opposition half saw Gil Smith score the game's opening try from a lineout move. The conversion from Tom Walton gave Thanet an early 7-0 lead.

Just as Thanet were restored to a full, complement, Ben Cannon was shown a yellow card for dangerous play. Old Alleynians' were unable to take advantage of the extra player and it was Thanet who extended their lead with a penalty from Tom Walton. Thanet were then pinned back in their own half, but from a clearance kick Thompson and Marshall forced Old Alleynians to give away a penalty. From the resulting maul the pack drove forward and Callum Doody was released to score extending

the home sides' lead to 15-0 after just 23 minutes of the match. One of the Old Alleynian's flankers was shown a yellow card and unlike the opposition Wanderers took advantage of the extra man. Thanet had the upper hand in the scrums and after several sets Lenny Brown scored a try which was converted. Thanet now had a commanding 22-0 lead, but as the half came to an end the visitors did cross the line to reduce the deficit to 22-5.

Old Alleynians started the second half on the front foot after that score and made a further inroad into Thanet's lead with a converted try taking the score to 22-12. For much of this half neither side was able to take control of the game primarily due to the weather and resulting pitch condition. As the game came to a close Lenny Brown scored his second try of the game which also gave Wanderers a bonus point. A final Walton conversion resulted in a final score of 29-12 to Thanet.

MATCH REPORT

AYLESFORD BULLS 29 THANET WANDERERS 27

Thanet will consider this a bad loss despite gaining two bonus points to remain third in the league table. Neither side started well swapping a number of penalties early on, but unable to create any positive field positions. The home side were reduced to fourteen men after 18 minutes when their prop was shown a yellow card for a number of high tackle offences. Bulls defended well keeping Thanet playing in the midfield and an interception on halfway saw the home side score the opening try under the posts, with the conversion taking them to a 7-0 lead. Spurred on, Aylesford were soon on the attack again and scored their second converted try three minutes later, on the half hour to take the score to 14-0. From the kick off Thanet created space to move the ball up the field. Wanderers were rewarded with a penalty and a lineout five metres from the opposition line. Again the Bulls were able to disrupt the play to regain the ball and return up the field over the halfway line. A number of unforced errors had Thanet on the back foot and as the half came to a close a third converted try saw the teams turn around with Thanet trailing 21-0.

Within a minute of the start of the second half Tom Walton slotted a penalty for Thanet's first score of the game. Ten minutes into the half Aylesford scored their fourth try leaving Thanet trailing 26-3 and not looking as if there would be a response to cut the deficit. This proved to be false as a passage of play and good support work

by the pack enabled Gil Smith to ground the ball, Thanet now trailed by 26-8. The hosts were again a man down after a number of penalties awarded against them led to a second yellow card, but did not concede points during this period of play. Bulls responded with a penalty to go out to a 29-8 lead. Thanet now started to put together good attacking passages of play and Giotto- McCourt-Welsh scored the team's second try. Walton's conversion left the score standing at 29-15 with less than 15 minutes to play. Again the play was mainly in the midfield with both teams gaining territory, but unable to set up any scoring opportunities. Aylesford received their third yellow card of the game with only four minutes of the match remaining. This time Wanderers took advantage of the field position with Callun Doody scoring to take Thanet to 29-20. Aylesford would have liked to put the game to bed after the kick off, but Thanet had a different idea. As the hosts were unable to stop a number of breaks from the backline Thanet were metres short and after recycling the ball Louis Marshall scored their fourth and important bonus point try. Another conversion by Walton meant the final score was 29-27.

Thanet upped their game in the last fifteen minutes of this match, but should have used their numerical advantage better.

MATCH REPORT

MEDWAY 3 - THANET WANDERERS 38

Wanderers travelled to Medway for the last away game of 2025 and a six try haul saw them end the year in second place in the league. Play early on saw Thanet penalised a number of times and an early penalty saw the home side take the lead after 8 minutes with a kick in front of the posts. Thanet responded soon afterwards, retaining possession from a lineout eight metres out the pack drove the opposition back and Finley Hickmott grounded the ball for the first try of the game. The next few passages of play saw both teams setup good opportunities to score but both sides were unable to complete the final pass. Thanet then went through a number of phases in midfield without advancing far until on 27 minutes Ben Cannon broke a number of attempted home side tackles to score Thanet's second try. Tom Walton kicked the conversion for a 12-3 lead.

The home side were a man down five minutes before half time as their number 8 was shown a yellow card for a deliberate knock on. Thanet moved up field and were awarded a scrum about 7 metres from the try line. A solid scrum enabled Cannon to pick up from the base and score his second try of the game. As the half came to an end the hosts were again penalised for a deliberate knock on and saw another player sent to the bin. There was still time for Wanderers to extend their lead as Tom Walton took advantage

of a loose lineout by Medway and he gathered the ball to score and then convert the try. Thanet had secured a try bonus point before half time with the lead now standing at 24-3.

The second half started with a flurry from Medway but they failed to cross the tryline. On 48 minutes Cannon was shown a red card for foul play. Medway were deep in Thanet's half for the next ten minutes of the game but staunch defence by Thanet and good discipline ensured that they did not score. Instead, an interception, by Walton, saw the field open for him to score his second try of the game. This he converted to extend the lead to 31-3. On the hour Thanet were down to 13 men as Louis Marshall was shown a yellow for dangerous play. Despite this Thanet maintained the upper hand in the game, having the majority of the possession but they were unfortunate not to score, whilst still disrupting Medway's attempts to gain further scoring opportunities. As the game came to a close Walton scored his hat trick try and with the conversion the final score was 38-3.

Despite playing the majority of the second half at least a player down Thanet maintained their shape throughout the game. Their overall defence during the game ensured Medway were unable to gain any meaningful scoring chances.

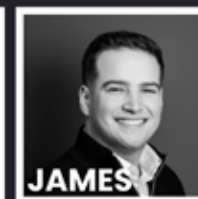

MATCH REPORT

MATCH REPORT

VIGO 10 - THANET WANDERERS 27

A try with the last play of the game gave Thanet a bonus point win in their first game of rugby after the Christmas break. The game did not start well for Wanderers as from the kick off they gave away a number of penalties which gave Vigo the upper hand. The home side took full advantage of these infringements after just three minutes to score an unconverted try and lead 5-0. Thanet responded well and within a few minutes took the lead after being awarded a penalty. Tom Walton took a quick tap and scored and then converted his own try to give Thanet a 5-7 advantage. A kick from Thanet's fly-half near the halfway line was charged down after fifteen minutes by one of Vigo's players who recovered the ball and sprinted to the line to score their second try of the game and regain the lead at 10-7. Neither side were able to make further scoring opportunities during the half with both teams giving away penalties allowing them to clear their lines.

Thanet were quick off their marks at the beginning of the second half, again taking advantage of Vigo giving away penalties. Five minutes after the break, Callum Doody scored Wanderers' second try to restore their lead to 10-12. The home side were then reduced to

14 men after one of their forwards was given a yellow card for not rolling away. Vigo were soon down another man with a yellow card being shown for a late tackle. Walton kicked the penalty to extend Thanet's lead to 15-10. Thanet were tested during this period and the home side looked the more likely to score, but strong and determined defence by Thanet denied any scoring opportunity. As Vigo hesitated, believing they should have been awarded a penalty, Adam Harrison scored Thanet's third try giving Wanderers a healthy 20-10 cushion with minutes of the game left. The home side were to finish the game with fourteen men as one of their locks was shown a red card for allegedly punching a Thanet player, Thanet broke away as the game came to a close and Walton scored his second try after breaking down the far touch line. The successful conversion made the final score 27 -10 to Wanderers.

This was a bonus point win with a very different scoreline from the 76-0 home win Thanet had achieved against Vigo earlier in the season, but Thanet stuck to their game to take the points.

During lockdown we were one of a handful of clubs to receive large grants for a capital project to renovate our back changing rooms and showers primarily for female use. We have also been one of the first clubs in the South East to introduce a SEND (Special Educational Needs and Disability) group and this has been amazingly well received. Our Schools and Community Programme has been marching forward with coaches going into local schools to introduce children to rugby that might not normally get the chance to play the game and experience the TREDs ethos (Teamwork, Respect, Enjoyment, Discipline and Sportsmanship) that lies at the heart of rugby. We have a mental health first aider who is available to listen and support anyone if they feel they need help.

This is only the beginning of the club's journey and we hope that everyone at the club, whether as a player, coach, parent or spectator will get behind us and help make Thanet Wanderers a welcoming place for ALL.

With this in mind we are introducing some new codes of conduct that you will see highlighted around the club and the grounds. These will explain what is considered good practice and what will not be tolerated. They will also give details of who you can contact if you have any concerns, issues or need help or support.

We live in a constantly changing society and if we want to play a positive, relevant and meaningful part in our community, both local and our rugby community, we need to adapt and be more accepting of the diverse society that we are all a part of.

Please work with us to make Thanet Wanderers a club where everyone is welcomed and made to feel part of something special.
