MATCH REPORT

THANET WANDERERS RUFC 34 – 27 AYLESFORD BULLS RFC

A sensational Second Half comeback earns maximum points for the Wanderers.

After a week's break, Thanet returned to Kent League 2 action against Aylesford at St Peters. The visitors were in fifth place in the league and unbeaten Wanderers in second at Kick Off. Wanderers regular number 10 and joint vice-captain, Adam Harrison, was unavailable. The team was indebted to Charlie Panteli and half-back partner Tom O'Callaghan who travelled from University to play in this match.

Aylesford kicked off down the slope on a dull November afternoon and were soon brightening the day for their supporters with a nicely worked try that was well converted for a 7-0 lead after five minutes. This became 14-0 seven minutes later when Aylesford were alert as a ball squirted loose and some simple handling put them in behind the Wanderers' defence to finish under the posts. A penalty took the visitors three points further clear before, with about ten minutes of the half remaining, Thanet got on the board. Callum Doody, who started the game on the left wing, gained good field position and the forwards took Wanderers close to the line. Lenny Brown who had just replaced the injured Dominick Springer in the front-row claimed the unconverted try. Loosehead Michael Whitehead switched to the tighthead berth. Wanderers were building well in the closing minutes of the half when a well telegraphed pass was grabbed by the Bulls' scrum half who outpaced the pursuers from just inside his own half to touch down under the posts. At half-time, minutes later, the visitors led 24-5.

Wanderers' coaching team were quick to respond to a half where the team's lack of energy and ideas had led to their worst session of the season. Notable changes saw James Crompton on in the pack and the Doody brothers Callum and Leon take over at half back.

Wanderers competed well in early exchanges but conceded a penalty after three minutes and Aylesford stretched their lead to 27-5. It

took until the 15th minute of the half before Wanderers' building pressure was rewarded. Downer's long penalty into the Bulls' 22 set the line-out and the pack went close before the ball was spun to Crompton whose determination and pace saw him crash over close to the posts. Downer's conversion made the score 27-12. The hosts were looking more like their usual selves. O'Callaghan was now playing on the wing and his good chase deserved a better outcome. A bouncing ball could have fallen for either side but the visitors were favoured by Lady Luck. Was it going to be that sort of day? Not if No 8 Ben Cannon had his way. First, a quality line-out set a series of forward drives and it was Cannon who made no mistake from close range. Downer's conversion attempt looked good but was not given. Thanet were getting closer and a series of strong drives had the Bulls on the back foot. A Bulls knockdown brought a clear penalty and from five metres out Cannon was unstoppable as he claimed a quick-fire brace. Downer's conversion was good so Wanderers now trailed 24-27. The Wanderers were flying and three minutes later a good line-out on the right led to a lovely flowing movement with Downer scything through before handing on to Harrison Quittenden who finished at pace near the left corner. No conversion but Thanet led for the first time, 29-27. Three minutes later a movement that started in the home half, flowed down the left wing through Cannon and Hickmott. Desperate Bulls defence closed that door but the ball was well recycled across the pitch before Callum Doody handed on to Quittenden whose well-timed pass sent O'Callaghan over in the right corner. No conversion but Wanderers led 34-27 with just enough time left for Wanderers to add to their supporters' grey hairs before today's referee, Lee Walker, blew the final whistle.

In an essentially young team, Veteran Andy Letts won the coaches' accolade as Wanderers' man of the match. Andy's experience and

tenacity were invaluable today in the most challenging circumstances faced so far this season. Congratulations to him and the coaching team whose changes changed the direction of the game. The RFU website shows Wanderers

are now top of Counties League 2 Kent as the only unbeaten side

WHAT MIGHT HAVE BEEN, A RUGBY WORLD LEAGUE

A while back, World Rugby proposed a World League that would consist of twelve teams: all Six Nations teams, the four major southern hemisphere sides plus Japan and the U.S.A. The International Rugby Players Council voiced its concern at the proposal, with some of the world's leading players expressing their views that some of the concerns they had raised had not been listened to and that to them the suggestion was unacceptable.

World Rugby responded by reiterating their commitment to player welfare and stating that a structured annual competition would make fans and new audiences more likely to watch, attend and engage with international rugby, exposing the sport to new fans worldwide. They also claimed that a structured annual international competition would yield significantly greater long-term global media revenue for investment in the global game with the project having at its heart long-term growth and stability, not short-term gains and that includes greater opportunities for players.

However, this proposal was embarrassing for a sport which claims to be based on the core values of "Integrity", "Solidarity" and "Respect" and it entrenched existing inequalities and marginalised those rugby nations that needed most support. So what would be the advantages and disadvantages of such a proposal?

Advantages

The main advantage would be the perceived potential to grow the game in emerging rugby markets. This idea seemed likely to appeal to a U.S. audience. The possibility of the U.S. Eagles playing regular fixtures against top opposition was sure to stimulate interest and help develop participation and revenue. Similarly, Japan's involvement would capitalise on earlier World Cup successes. Both of these "Tier 2" rugby nations had booming sports markets which could be tapped into as a result in participation in a World League and the proposed year long competition was likely to engage more "casual" rugby fans. It was argued that such a model

should also appeal to broadcasters who could market all the fixtures as a package. Bringing increased revenue into the game could grow it more generally allowing World Rugby to reinvest more into the sport's development.

Disadvantages

One large drawback of the "World League" proposal was the exclusion of the Pacific Nations. This would have been a betrayal of the region's historic contribution to international rugby, in particular the on-field success of Fiji and the exclusion of the incredible natural talent these small countries produce. To exclude Fiji who in rugby terms ranked above Italy, the U.S.A. and Japan would have been entirely at odds with everything the sport is about. Georgia too would have needed consideration for inclusion in a "World League". Sport, particularly international sport must be a meritocracy if it is to retain its integrity. The very essence of sport is fair and open competition; "may the best team win" In the case of the proposed "World League" it seemed to be "may the best rich team win", so it was not really a sporting competition, but an elite club, a cartel.

World Rugby Bye-Law 3(d) states that the objectives and functions of World Rugby include: "To regulate and co-ordinate arrangements to ensure that there is a fair and equitable programme of matches, tours and tournaments for Senior National Representative Teams of all Council Member Unions".

This clearly did not hold for Fiji who are a Council Member. The fact that the proposal was for a twelve year deal would effectively have locked them out of top flight international competition for twelve years which would mean that in Tier 2 rugby nations the game would be more likely to die than thrive in those countries. If players from these countries were unable to play in the biggest games and there was a lack of commercial security they were more likely to move away and seek to qualify for other nations through residency.

Player Welfare

Another issue flagged up by the IRPC was that of the toll the proposal would put on top players. It would see the best two teams play 13 matches in a calendar year including five on consecutive weekends in the autumn. This gruelling schedule, which would also conflict with the Northern Hemisphere club season, did not have the players' best interests at heart. Perhaps of greater concern was the long distance travel the proposal would entail. This was a recipe for player burnout, under-performance and perhaps even injury.

Rugby Concerns

Having an annual competition featuring twelve teams seemed ludicrous. Rugby World Cups are special because they occur every four years and are a rare meeting of teams from across the globe competing for the ultimate crown of being the best in the world. The "World League" would have totally devalued such a prize and the charm of the RWC. Also, how would the Lions tours have fitted in with the proposal? These are a unique feature of international rugby which should be preserved as far as possible.

The Fans

Fans don't want to watch tired players playing low quality test matches. Furthermore under the twelve year deal the fixtures would have been the same every year. No touring would also have been a disappointment for travelling fans. Groups of supporters often make the trip out to one of the Southern Hemisphere rugby playing nations to follow their team for a series of games, but under the proposal such fans would have to have been able to afford to travel to not one country, but three, so travelling support was likely to be negligible, impacting the atmosphere at the matches. Given the sums of money that were mentioned it was almost inevitable that matches would have been broadcast behind a pay wall. This would have cut off the very fans that Rugby World was trying to reach with their new format. In the end all that World Rugby and the chosen unions would have been left with would have been a large sum of money from broadcasting, which perhaps reflects where World Rugby's priorities really were.

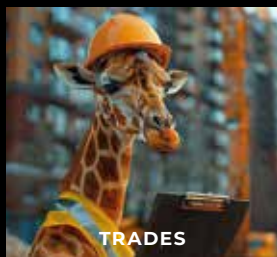

MATCH REPORT

WESTCOMBE PARK RFC 14 – 35 THANET WANDERERS RUFC

Wanderers' winning run continues after a sparkling performance in Orpington

A strong Wanderers side travelled to take on the Tigers of Westcombe Park. Andy Letts was at Twickenham but vice captains Adam Harrison at number ten and outside centre Henry Mirams returned after missing the Aylesford match. Lenny Brown retained his loosehead spot after last week's strong performance and Callum Doody resumed at scrum-half after last week's outing in the ten shirt.

Wanderers kicked off on a typically dull November afternoon and quickly established themselves in the opposition half. After only four minutes Lewis Downer converted a penalty opportunity from twenty-two metres and just left of the posts for an early 3-0 lead. A succession of penalties made it difficult for both sides to settle. Penalty attempts for the hosts on twelve minutes and five minutes later for the Wanderers both rebounded from a post but did not go to hand. Thanet went for a tap penalty from a kickable position but were unable to cross the line. The hosts were giving Thanet's defence a thorough examination but they could find no way through. As the half-hour mark neared, Wanderers launched a series of spirited attacks but were finally held up. The dropout was caught by Thanet's number Six James Crompton who raced back at pace dodging defenders for a superb individual try finishing just left of the posts to ease Downer's conversion. Wanderers led 10-0. It had been a close half and the Tigers now used their extra weight to test Thanet's defence again. They too passed on an easy three points and used a penalty to set a line out five metres out. A well-worked catch and drive and the hosts had a try. A difficult conversion was good and it was 10-7 to the Wanderers at halftime.

Wanderers coaches brought on Skip Lube and Cornell Fredericks from the bench for the second half. The two South Africans, who are

on an exchange visit at Wanderers sponsor St Lawrence College in Ramsgate added their welcome attributes to the team. Dennis Davies and Andrew Dolan took a break. Harrison's penalty in the first minute of the second half set a good attacking position. The attacks built with good handling between Brett Scott and Crompton before a penalty, close to the posts, was again run and Skip Lube crashed through to open his debut in style. Downer's conversion gave Wanderers a 17-7 lead. The try scorer caught the restart and counter-attacked powerfully making 30 metres and sent Brett Scott away to initiate the attack that ended with winger Louis Marshall touching down close to the touchline. The game had just restarted when Wanderers Ben Cannon was shown yellow for a high tackle. The Tigers added a converted try during his enforced absence to narrow the gap to 22-14. Lenny Brown had another fine game and he was now at the heart of the move that saw Scott and Crompton make metres before Crompton claimed his double and the try bonus point. No conversion, but Thanet were ahead 27-14. Wanderers were offered another penalty opportunity and this time Downer took the three-point option for a 30-14 lead. A storming finish showed great fitness from the Wanderers. Cornel Fredericks was involved in the early build-up before the pack took over and a series of great forward drives followed before Michael Whitehead was on hand to end an overwhelming final push for the line and claim the touchdown. Downer's conversion attempt dropped just short before the referee signalled time with Wanderers the winners by 35-14.

This was a hard-earned win against the Tigers who are the second string of the side who play in National League 2. Wanderers' defence was superb and a willingness to attack from anywhere tested the opposition's defence throughout the match. Thanet have a good level of fitness and their game management today was top quality. Head Coach, Elliot

Blackmore thanked Skip and Cornell for their help and complimented young lock forward, Charlie Bailey on an excellent performance. Double try scorer James Crompton had another

superb game and he was the coaches' choice as Wanderers' man of the match.

MATCH REPORT

THANET WANDERERS U15S VS TONBRIDGE JUDDIANS U15S

10th November at Thanet Wanderers RUFC

Sunday the 10th bought perfect conditions for Thanet U15s to host TJs, the first meetings of these two teams for many years. Currently TJs are one league above Thanet and are currently unbeaten in their league fixtures to date. A tough day at the office was envisaged and before the game the coaches challenged the squad to carry on their excellent recent form and start the game as they had finished the last.

Rising to the challenge the team played one of their best halves of rugby to date, building on the confidence from their recent victories and immediately putting TJs under immense pressure. The midweek Wednesday sessions have been about building structure and encouraging the team to play what they see in front of them with speed and determination. It seems that in every fixture we play we give up a lot in size and weight but make up for it in the speed that the game is played and with excellent fitness levels. This game was no exception.

Almost from the start TJs were under pressure. A deft kick over the top from No 10 Finlay Smith almost resulted in a try but Milo Whitehead was just unable to collect the ball and a knock on resulted in a TJs scrum 5 meters from their posts. A big shove from the much smaller Thanet pack had the scrum won against the head and after a series of pick and goes Ben Morris picked up from the back of the ruck and charged over for the first of his tries. Ben's recent progress, alongside Noah Manga and Ethan Morgan, have shown the results of the hard work put in by the forward coaches. The celebrations after the try were enough to see that the confidence was there for the team to push on. The trusty boot of Finlay Smith slotted the conversion and Thanet were leading 7-0 within a few minutes of kick off.

On the 10-minute mark a fluid backs move saw Jamie Barbara joining the line from 15 and the TJs defence was penalised for not rolling

away. Finlay Smith lined up the kick from just inside the 22, it hit the post, bounced down onto the bar and over and the lead grew to 10-0. The confidence in the backs has been a testament to the time and effort put in by the backs coach Tim Sperryn who has got them playing with huge amounts of flair and confidence.

A well worked restart from TJs saw them regain possession but the speed of the Thanet defence saw TJs losing ground. The breakdown was an area Thanet were excelling in and a penalty for holding on went to Thanet just inside the TJs half. Finlay Smith looked to kick to touch but instead took a quick tap and chipped over the TJs defence. The ball took an awkward bounce and Finlay and the TJs 15 battled for the ball which ended up with the ball breaking free allowing Milo Whitehead to touch down to put Thanet 15-0 ahead. Another successful conversion increased the lead to 17-0.

From the restart Thanet were on the attack again. Great work from the impressive Jamie Barbara at 15 saw him rip the ball from a TJs player's hands and Noah Manga went surging through to within 5 meters of the line. A penalty to Thanet for entering the ruck from the side saw Ben Williams take a quick tap and dive over the line. The conversion was missed, and Thanet were now 22-0 up.

From the restart the ball found its way back into the TJs 22 via some good interplay between the forwards and backs and a resultant penalty to Thanet saw Finlay launch a high kick deep into the TJs 22 which they failed to deal with. A strong run from Gab Petrauskas punched a hole in the TJs defence and Ben Morris was fed by the Thanet 9, Jack Sperryn, to drive over for his second try. Finlay's faithful boot put the score to 29-0 with under 10 minutes to go in the half.

The next 5 minutes saw TJs have a good spell of possession in the Thanet half. The pressure was released when from a ruck the ball was

moved very quickly through the backs to Isaac Rowland-Day who was able to show his lightning speed and ran from one 22 to the other. A missed kick to touch from TJs had the ball in Finlay Smith's hands and the resultant backs move saw Andrew Bull step inside the TJs 15 and then with the conversion the score at Half Time was 36-0.

Half time saw all those at the club coming together on the 1st XV pitch to take part in the minutes silence.

Such a lead at half time actually was more of a hinderance than a help as a spot of complacency set in and some slack passing in the first few minutes saw an excellent interception by the TJs outside centre who raced away from the half way line and bought the score back to 36-7.

TJs started to find some fluency and the next 10 minutes was a much more even contest. With the other age groups finishing their training sessions the crowd was slowly growing, and they were treated to a highly competitive third quarter albeit with Thanet still in the ascendancy. A TJs lineout on their

5-metre line saw their jumper drop the ball straight into Gabs Petrauskas hands and he quickly took advantage and dived over the line to increase the score to 41-7.

Harry Knowles came on to replace Isaac Rowland-Day on the wing and it wasn't long before his pace saw him touch down after Thanet won back position on the TJs 22. Another exceptional kick from Finlay Smith from wide out on the 22 saw the final score of 48-7 to Thanet.

To say that was a surprise result would be an understatement. The biggest compliment came from their coaches who thought our performance was worthy not only of a team in their division but probably of a team in Division 1.

The next few weeks sees a rest from competitive matches until 'Le Petit Crunch' which sees many of the squad pitched against each other in the CCGS and St Lawrence squads.

Well done to Harry Davies and Jamie Barbara who were nominated as the teams forward ad back of the match.
