

MATCH REPORT

Thanet Wanderers RUFC 7 - 33 Bromley RFC

A much-improved performance is not enough to prevent another defeat for the Wanderers.

Danny Clement and Michael Whitehead returned to the front row in an otherwise unchanged pack. There were starts for Lewis Downer and Louic Vroninks who replaced Louis Marshall and Marius Thompson who were injured last Saturday. Bromley had impressed in the away fixture which they won 47-18 and are presently fifth in the League table.

Wanderers kicked off down the slope on a chilly, grey afternoon and monopolised possession in the opening minutes. Thanet were not playing like a bottom-of-thetable side and it was somewhat against the run of play when, after ten minutes, the visitors opened the scoring with an unconverted try. Wanderers lost opportunities when a line-out was not straight and a penalty failed to find touch. Bromley were testing the home defence. On 25 minutes a missed clearance gave the visitors possession which led to a converted try and opened a 12-0 lead. Bromley's outside half looked to be on his way for a further try before he was pulled down by his opposite number, Charlie Panteli, to stop an almost certain try. There was a collective determination about the Wanderers in the fifteen minutes before halftime that kept their line intact and ensured that they trailed by just twelve points at halftime.

Early in the second half, Bromley took a scrum rather than kick a penalty and from the resultant drive a player

emerged and crossed unchallenged for a converted try. Wanderers responded with a spirited, forward-led, attack that ended with a third try of the season for Mike Whitehead. Panteli converted well to cut the visitors' lead to 19-7 after seven second-half minutes. There was an intriguing contest as both sides battled for the next score and a yellow card was shown to Bromley's number seven. Replacement centre, Henry Mirams, returned after injury into a reorganised backline as Vroninks took a break. Max Rogers, who has been playing well in the centre for the Wanderers, was now shown yellow for a high tackle. Bromley were pushing hard for their try-bonus point and they eventually crossed wide left and added an excellent conversion to lead 26-7. A loose ball bounced nicely for the visitors who crossed for a fifth try to extend their lead to 33-7. Wanderers fought hard during the remaining ten minutes but could not add to their score before today's referee, Mr Oliver Smith, sounded full-time, after a good shift from the young official.

Wanderers' coaches and supporters will have been pleased to see this much more organised and determined performance from their side. There were still occasional errors and areas that need to be addressed but with a side containing so much developing talent, medium-term prospects remain good.

As a club Thanet Wanderers is committed to improving all aspects of equality, inclusion and diversity within the club. I'm sure most of you will have seen the re-emergence of our ladies team after an absence of nearly 20 years. The girls section is growing steadily with the help of a strong team of volunteers, coaches and sponsors. During lockdown we were one of a handful of clubs to receive large grants for a capital project to renovate our back changing rooms and showers primarily for female use. We have also been one of the first clubs in the South East to introduce a SEND (Special Educational Needs and Disability) group and this has been amazingly well received. Our Schools and Community Programme has been marching forward with coaches going into local schools to introduce children to rugby that might not normally get the chance to play the game and experience the TREDS ethos (Teamwork, Respect, Enjoyment, Discipline and Sportsmanship) that lies at the heart of rugby. We have a mental health first aider who is available to listen and support anyone if they feel they need help.

This is only the beginning of the club's journey and we hope that everyone at the club, whether as a player, coach, parent or spectator will get behind us and help make Thanet Wanderers a welcoming place for ALL.

With this in mind we are introducing some new codes of conduct that you will see highlighted around the club and the grounds. These will explain what is considered good pratice and what will not be tolerated. They will also give details of who you can contact if you have any concerns, issues or need help or support.

We live in a constantly changing society and if we want to play a positive, relevant and meaningful part in our community, both local and our rugby community, we need to adapt and be more accepting of the diverse society that we are all a part of.

MATCH REPORT

Thanet Wanderers Twos 10 – 43 Rye RFC

Rye score seven tries to maintain their position at the top of Kent Rural A-League.

Frost had caused the postponement of most of the rugby scheduled on Saturday in Kent, including Wanderers' first XV's visit to Cranbrook. East Kent was the exception, with two matches played at Thanet and nearby Deal's games also went ahead.

Rye were Champions of the Kent B rural league last season and are presently top of Kent A rural, having lost only one game this season. Wanderers 2s are in fifth place in the ten-team league and the away fixture was lost 45-5. Captain, Tom Stevens, was not available as he recuperates after a head injury assessment, Joe Carlier stood in for him, his front row partners were Luke Browning at hooker and Mike Morris at tighthead. Both of the Doody brothers are usually scrum halves but today they paired up at half-back with Callum at Ten and Leon at nine. It was good to see former first-team skipper, Adam Gaddes, back in the second row where he partnered with Matt Jacobs.

The frost may have relented but was replaced by a bitterly cold wind as Rye kicked off up the slope in front of a decent crowd including a good sprinkling from East Sussex. Eight minutes in, the visitors sent a penalty to seven metres out and touched down a couple of minutes later, just right of the posts. Minutes later Rye scored their second try in a very similar position and again converted for a 14-0 lead. Wanderers responded well and built pressure down Rye's right before Joe Carlier

touched down to make the score 14-5. A good individual try with a nice conversion extended Rye's lead before Will Mahoney responded for Wanderers touching down their second try on the cusp of half-time. There was no conversion into the strong wind and Wanderers trailed 21-10 at the break.

Wanderers played with the stiffening breeze behind them for the second half and enjoyed an early period of pressure but a lost scrum at a crucial point and balls dropped by frozen hands, plus good defence from Rye, kept the score unchanged until, with around a quarter of the match remaining, the visitors broke clear and ran in from distance outflanking the home defence and touched down under the posts. A very similar try, with ten minutes remaining, took Rye clear 33-10. Two further tries in the closing minutes, against a tiring Thanet side, were not converted and meant that Rye had won 43-10. The coaches' choice as Man of the Match was young scrum-half Leon Doody for his combative performance against strong opposition.


Thanet Wanderers 3s 10 – 29 Vigo 2s


