#### DARTFORD VALLEY RFC 12 - 12 THANET WANDERERS RUFC

Wanderers' defence secures a draw after a patchy display on the 3G pitch at Dartford Valley.

There were six changes to the Thanet side that had played well in their last game against Sidcup. Andy Letts returned to the second row where he was partnered by debutant Charlie Bailey. Tom O'Callaghan travelled to return at scrum-half but after Cam Beck was injured at training on Thursday the backs were reshuffled with Louis Marshall playing outside centre. Vice-Captain, Henry Mirams, was working and Callum Doody again proved his versatility by stepping in at full-back. Harrison Quittenden returned to the starting XV and it was good to see fellow speedster, Andrew Dolan back on the other wing for his first game since January.

Wanderers were quick to follow up their kick-off and put pressure on the catcher. Two penalties against the hosts saw the pressure maintained and a further penalty set a good attacking position. Joint Vice-Captain, Adam Harrison, passed up an easy three points and took the tap penalty before passing over the top and opened up the defence for Louis Marshall to power over for the opening try after ten minutes. The wind was strengthening and caused Lewis Downer's conversion attempt to fall just short but Thanet led, 5-0. Wanderers number 6. James Crompton was an early casualty with a shoulder injury and was replaced by Finley Hickmott.

Penalty numbers continued to mount for both sides, and Harrison made good use to clear Wanderers' lines. A terrific tackle from openside, Sam Taylor, caused a loose ball around 20 metres out which loose-head, Ben Cannon seized and brushed off attempted tackles before touching down close to the posts. Lewis Downer added the extras and opened up a 12-0 lead for the Wanderers. They had dominated the opening quarter of the game but now good pressure from the home side and a smart switch of the point of attack brought them a try. No conversion made it 12-5. Wanderers' influential open-side Sam Taylor now had to leave the pitch with the

recurrence of an injury to a knee. Dom Springer replaced him in a much-reshuffled pack. On the cusp of half-time, Ben Cannon, who appeared to be as much sinned against as a sinner, found himself the sole recipient of a yellow card after a sudden flurry of handbags.

Rain had set in towards the end of the first half and conditions were miserable at best. Playing with fourteen men. Wanderers' defence was busy, but up to the task. Andy Letts became the second Wanderer to be shown yellow shortly before Cannon's return. Six minutes later strong Dartford pressure brought them a second try, which was converted, to level the scores at 12 all. Wanderers' captain, Warren Riddell-Bloomfield, was playing at hooker today, rather than in his usual back-row berth, but in another excellent defensive display he excelled and led his team by fine example. Callum Doody who was also out of his usual scrum half role to play at fullback used his boot well as he sought to ease the continuing home pressure. Teenager, Charlie Bailey had played with growing confidence on his debut but now became the third Wanderer to enter the referee's notebook. Sam Taylor returned despite clearly still struggling with injury. Four minutes later, sadly Andrew Dolan was forced to withdraw from the struggle with injury and Leon Doody replaced him. With about ten minutes remaining, Thanet were finally back to full numbers in the second half and mounted some promising attacks but the final whistle sounded with the scores still level at 12-12.

Wanderers' defence was again outstanding with another top performance from Number Eight, Brett Scott. Tighthead, Michael Whitehead put in an excellent full shift and Ben Cannon goes from strength to strength on the other side of the front row. Lewis Downer defended brilliantly at inside centre and was a regular threat with the ball in hand; he was the Coaches' choice as Thanet's man of the match.

#### THANET WANDERERS RUFC LADIES 61 LORDSWOOD VALKYRIES 7

Thanet Wanderers Ladies returned to St Peter's after a month for a top of the table clash with Lordswood Valkyries with both sides boasting a 20 player squad. Thanet won the toss and skipper Gee Cordell chose to play down the slope to try and put pressure on the Lordswood defence.

Pack leaders Holly Thurman-Newell and Georgia Elks, both playing with a new lease of life were making inroads into the Lordswood defence who were under pressure in the early exchanges.

Having moved defenders around, fly half Alex White scanned and spotted a gap in the left corner and scampered in from 15 metres out for an early 5-0 lead.

That lead was added to shortly afterwards with centre Izzy Lodge dominating the midfield and feeding centre partner Rachael Austerberry and then Tabs Raymonde for two quick tries. White converted one and Thanet raced out to a 17-0 lead with 20 minutes on the clock.

Shortly after scrum half, Sophie West had to leave the field with a rib injury making room for Kat Stuart to play her first game at scrum half. She controlled her forward pack as if it was her fiftieth game and having moved Lordswood defenders where she wanted them, spun the ball out for Austerberry to hit a gap and race in for her second.

Lordswood are a determined side and spent long periods at the end of the first half in the Thanet 22, but some dominant turnover work from hooker Louise Rubens led to winger Lia Armstrong scooping up the loose ball and running in from 80 yards. The try was converted by White for a 29-0 half time lead.

Half time saw some regrouping from both sides with Rebecca Hewitt joining the front row and Rebecca Dixon making her Thanet debut at blindside flanker.

But it was to be Lordswood who made the first score after White's pass was intercepted by Lordswood centre Malissa Burniston to go 80 metres and reduce the lead to 29-7.

The Thanet ladies didn't seem phased by this, saw it as a blip and set about putting their structured rugby back together. Soon after Austerberry completed her hat-trick and skipper, Cordell went 60 metres to get her name on the scoresheet.

Gaps were appearing in a tiring Lordswood defence and Austerberry used her experience to claim her fourth, fifth and sixth tries before feeding Armstrong for her second. One final conversion by White saw Wanderers stretch out to a 61-7 victory.

Thanet Ladies travel to Beckenham next Sunday in the league before hosting Lordswood on Sunday 27th October in the second round of the Junior Cup.



#### DEAL WANDERERS COLTS 10 - THANET WANDERERS COLTS 33

Thanet Wanderers secured a comprehensive 33-10 victory over Deal Wanderers in a hard-fought and physical match on a windy but sunny day in Deal. This marks Thanet's fifth win of the season, continuing their strong start. Both teams showed resilience, but Thanet's clinical execution and dominance in key moments were decisive.

The game began with both sides feeling each other out, but Thanet eventually made the first breakthrough after sustained pressure. A well-orchestrated move saw the ball move from the left flank after two phases with strong carries from the front row combination of the two Finns. A slick pass from Alex Dyer set up Jem Harris, who sliced through the defense to score under the posts. Fly-half Callum Duffy adding the conversion to give Thanet a 7-0 lead.

Deal Wanderers responded with pressure on Thanet's try line. However, a crucial interception from Callum halted their attack, allowing him to sprint the length of the pitch. Making a smart decision under pressure to go for the corner, he grounded the ball and then audaciously slotted the conversion, pushing the score to 14-0.

Thanet's open-side flanker, Charlie Page, was everywhere on the field, producing brilliant turnovers to regain possession and was continually disrupting Deal's attack. Though Deal mounted a comeback, on putting their winger into clear space, a try-saving head on tackle by Full back Jem Harris temporarily held them at bay. However, in the next phase Deal found a gap on the right wing, where their centre stepped through to score, reducing the deficit to 14-7.

In the Second Half, Thanet struck again with a dynamic run through the middle by Noah Bull, who displayed lovely footwork. Although a knock-on denied him a try, the ensuing attack led to a lineout. Dillon Shelley safely secured the ball, and after a driving maul, a well-timed pass allowed Harrison Taylor to power over

under the posts. Callum added the conversion, extending the lead to 21-7.

Deal responded with a penalty, opting to kick for points, bringing the score to 21-10.

Thanet soon regained control through a strong turnover by Vinnie Jones and quick ball from Kai Redmond set up Will Gedge for a line break, and after another rapid phase, Harrison Taylor again bulldozed over the line for his second try of the match. Thanet were now comfortably ahead at 28-10.

In the final moments, Thanet's defense continued to be strong. A standout moment came when Carl Gordan- Durrant hoisted a Deal player in the air before Charlie Page stripped him of the ball. Taking advantage, the ball was swiftly moved down the blind side, allowing Harry Harrison to skillfully finish off the move and seal the 33-10 win for Thanet.

The coaches praised the team's physicality and discipline throughout the game, highlighting the competitive environment in the squad. Charlie Page was particularly commended for his exemplary tackle count and multiple turnovers and named Man of the Match. The strong squad depth is creating competition for starting positions, which is set to further strengthen the team moving forward.

Thanet Wanderers Colts now sit with 5 wins and 1 loss this season, looking ahead to the upcoming cup match and continuing their impressive form.

#### THANET WANDERERS RUFC 21 - 8 SIDCUP RFC

Wanderers remain unbeaten and replace Sidcup in second place in the league.

Ben Cannon and Sam Taylor were back in Thanet's pack but Andy Letts was playing in Kent's "Wooden Spoon" team and hooker Finn White was on duty. Captain, Warren Riddell-Bloomfield moved from the back row to replace him and Lenny Brown was restored to the second row. Callum Doody was injured, and his brother, Leon proved to be a very able deputy at scrum half. Adam Harrison returned at Ten and there was a debut for Charlie Stainton on the left wing.

Wanderers kicked off on a lovely afternoon for rugby and a nervous response to their first attack drew a penalty that Lewis Downer safely despatched to give Wanderers an early lead, 3-0. This was short-lived as Sidcup attacked from the restart and a penalty set them close to the Thanet line. Good defence kept the line intact initially but a well-judged crosskick produced a fine opening score for Sidcup that could not be converted but gave them the lead, 5-3. A Wanderers' penalty did not reach touch and Sidcup returned to the attack. After fifteen minutes, Downer, playing at inside centre, made a scything break to set a good field position and a stretched defence was guilty of not releasing. Downer confidently slotted his second penalty to put Wanderers ahead 6-5. Thanet continued to attack and another penalty opportunity, four minutes later, a little further out saw Downer convert and Thanet led, 9-5. James Crompton playing at blindside, broke clear but was dragged down. Play swung from one half to the other and both defences stood strong. There was danger for the visitors every time Henry Mirams and Adam Harrison counter-attacked and it was a good game to watch. Wanderers were penalised for a high tackle and Sidcup narrowed Thanet's lead to a point from 30 metres out. There was a determination about Wanderers today and they continued to press for the line.

Forward after forward aimed for the line and the finish finally came from Ben Cannon who claimed a well-deserved first try for the first XV. There was no conversion but Wanderers led 14-8, which was the half-time score a few minutes later.

Wanderers had played well in a very satisfactory first half and coaches will have asked for more of the same for the second half. Mike Whitehead took a break and Luke Browning was back in the front row for the second period. Harrison Quittenden replaced Stainton after his satisfactory debut A knock-on from the restart gave Sidcup good field position but Wanderers withstood the resulting attack and a brilliant breakout from Harrison switched play from near the Wanderers' line to close at the other end. The hosts' intensity appeared to have dipped early in the second half and they lost a good opportunity when they were deemed to have offended after a minor altercation on the visitors' line. A pair of penalties took Sidcup close to Wanderers' line whose defence was sound. Louis Marshall was on his way to the line but was recalled for an offside. Probing attacks from both sides were met with resolute defence and there was no change to the score after an hour's play. Taylor took a break after another valuable contribution and Finley Hickmott replaced him from the bench. Wanderers' defence was hitting hard and low enough for any purist but when a Wanderer disputed a decision of today's excellent referee, Alan Whittingham, they found themselves marched back ten metres. A crucial steal from Brown put the Wanderers back on the front foot and the initiative was with the Wanderers. A concerted attack took them close before Hickmott broke well and handed on to Harrison to touch down. Downer's conversion was good for a 21-8 lead. Sidcup contested hard in the closing minutes looking for a losing bonus point but there was no further score and the well deserved victory was with the Wanderers.

A good interception by Jack Sperryn from the opposition scrum got Thanet to the halfway line. Quick hands returned OE's to close to our line and from the ensuing scrum Finlay Smith kicked for safety. The strong OE's number 15 caught the ball and then slipped a few too many tackles for this coaches liking and touched down in the corner.

A strong kick chase from the kick off put OE's on the back foot and good runs from Isaac Rowland-Day and Nye Potter mounted the pressure on the OE's defence. A penalty allowed a quick tap and go, and Milo Whitehead looked to be over when he was pulled back for the penalty not being taken from the correct place. Calmer heads prevailed and finally Smith kicked the penalty for a scoreline at the end of the first quarter of 5-3 to OE's.

The restart for the 2nd quarter resulted in a knock on by OE's and from the scrum Thanet ran their Ramsgate ball to the blindside, and it was only a last-ditch tackle from the OE's 15 that prevented a try. From another penalty tap and

go a disappointing knock on was the result and from the resulting scrum OE's broke away from the halfway and touched down for their second try. The conversion was a good one and Thanet found themselves 12-3 down from what had been a very promising position at the other end of the park.

There followed a 10-minute session of play that Thanet would want to forget. OE's pressure at the scrum was a lot for Thanet to handle and another 2 tries were run in giving the visitors a lead of 26-3 at the half time break.

Some Thanet substitutions were made and there was a slightly concerned feeling about how the game could possibly go in the second half. Some big tackles going in from the centre pairing of Andrew Bull and Milo Whitehead put OE's on the back foot and a strong run from Gab Petrauskas ended in a penalty for a high tackle. From the resultant penalty, a quick tap and go saw the Thanet No 8 George Saunders burst over the line.

The tide was certainly changing, and a rather worried OE's coach commented to me that he could see a definite change of momentum. The increased tempo and drive now being shown by Thanet resulted in two more tries, one from Milo Whitehead, who had an immense game, and Nye Potter who doesn't seem to go a game without having a huge influence.

The never say die attitude suddenly had Thanet only two points behind at 24-26 and the victory was certainly on as the momentum was definitely with them.

From the OE's kick off Noah Manga, a new addition to the pack, took the ball at pace, driving the OE's defence back. Noah has recently moved from the backs and the promise he showed in this game has the coaches very excited for the sort of impact he will have for the rest of the season.

Unfortunately, and against the run of play, a slight lapse in concentration saw some great hands from the OE's backs and they touched down in the corner to take the wind out of the Thanet sails. Another late try right on the whistle gave OE's a winning score of 24-40, a margin of victory that didn't quite reflect the game.

Lots of work to do for Thanet, but Pete Macaulay was on the sideline assessing the performance and the coaches are looking forward to working with him to find areas for improvement. The pleasing thing was that the team fought back from a deficit of 26-3 and through some great rugby and a renewed spirit fought back to 26-24.


The team now have some training time followed by a development game against Whitstable in the middle of October, so plenty of time to iron out the creases in time for their first League game against Dover on October 20th.
