### THANET WANDERERS 22-27 WESTCOMBE PARK 2ND XV

This was a game where Thanet played a lot of time on the back foot, despite taking the lead with a penalty straight from the kick off. The first half was influenced by the yellow card given to Ben Cannon, apparently for being offside. Thanet had given away a number of penalties and now a penalty drew the visitors level. As the game restarted Thanet were deemed offside and Westcombe Park took the lead 3-6 with a penalty.

Almost on the half hour despite a turnover in the opposition's half, Thanet then lost the ball and it was run back in from the visitor's half to score a try that was converted making the lead 3-13. Thanet were not about to give up and Nick Herbert made a brilliant break from his own half and then a simple pass gave Louis Marshall the opportunity to score. With the conversion secured Thanet were now only three points behind as the game approached half time. Just before the break Cannon, carrying the ball, was deemed to have led with his forearm when fending off a defender and he received a second yellow card which was automatically upgraded to a red.

The second half would become a challenge for Thanet, but they did take the lead early in the second period. Despite originally being held up, the next passage of play saw Henry Mirams intercept the ball and run in another try for Thanet to take the lead 17-13. Wanderers extended their lead and despite the man deficit showed their mettle when Marius Thompson reacted to a ball fumbled by Westcombe Park on their line and scored. The conversion was missed, but Thanet were now 22-13 up with twenty minutes of the game to play. Thanet continued to knock on the door, but they were hampered by being a man down. Just after the hour mark, Westcombe Park ran in under the posts and it was now a two point game, 22-20. Late in the match Westcombe scored what was to be the decisive winning try. Despite that, Thanet were unlucky to have been deemed held up or knocked on over the line in the very last play of the match.

A hard fought game from which the home side deserved more, but came away with only a losing bonus point.




