Happy Birthday to Ron the Dog, never grow up.





AYLESFORD RFC 31 - 7 THANET WANDERERS RUFC

Wanderers' downturn continues at Aylesford. Danny Clement returned to the Thanet front row, replacing Noah Dann, who was unavailable. Charlie Bailey started at eight in place of Ben Cannon, who widened his rugby experience at inside centre. Leon Doody was in for his brother Callum who was imminently due to become a father, at scrum-half. Second Team captain, Tom Stevens again answered the call up and was on one wing and it was good to see Harrison Quittenden back on the other. Aylesford started the match in ninth place and remained there despite today's win and Wanderers cling on to second place by one point with Old Alleynians 2s hot on their heels.

It was a chilly and grey afternoon but there was no warm welcome for the Wanderers travelling faithful who, with other nonlunchers, were excluded from the clubhouse prior to the match.

Wanderers kicked off and there was good handling from both sides in the opening minutes. Quittenden's tackle stopped one Bulls' attack near the line but after ten minutes the hosts were playing with a penalty advantage near Thanet's 22. A speculative chip through was not dealt with and Wanderers paid the price, 5-0 to the hosts as the conversion was dragged left. Lenny Brown joined from the bench due to Clement's blood injury and the Bulls were called back for a forward pass as they touched down. However, their second try was not long coming and again a well-judged chip was gathered for a touchdown wide right. An excellent conversion from near the touchline followed to make it 12-0 after 22 minutes. A good tackle from Andrew Dolan halted a promising attack for the Bulls. Doody made a sharp break before being swallowed up and Thanet were looking promising. An attack broke down and a lone Bull was sharp to make a turnover and aim for Wanderers try line from his own 22. He was almost there but Cannon tracked back at speed to make a try saving

tackle and ensure there was no change in the score at halftime two minutes later.

Words from the Coaches had the desired result and there was a clear improvement from Thanet at the beginning of the second period. Finley Hickmott was soon joined by Lenny Brown and Mike Whitehead as the bench was emptied. A series of attacks on our left with Andy Letts prominent promised much but were halted by good home defence before with eight minutes of the half the team recovered well from a poor line-out. An excellent break by James Crompton took him almost to the line before being brought down and a long pass then took defenders out and gave Hickmott a clear run to touch down. Quittenden made a fine conversion from near touch and Wanderers were back in the game at 12-7. They continued to press and were attacking in midfield near the opposition's 22 when Aylesford intercepted and were off to the line. Quittenden closed before the line was reached but a lobbed pass brought a try under the posts and seven points to regain a twelvepoint lead. There was a good battle for the next important score before it went to the home side. Wanderers were again undone by a chip through with a neat pick-up and a touch down under the posts. 26-7 and a try bonus point for the Bulls. A fifth try came five minutes later after a Bull stepped inside a couple of tackles to score a fifth try that was not converted. Around ten minutes remained and Thanet returned to the attack. A potential try was deemed to have been held up and they could find no way through during a prolonged attack on Aylesford's right flank. The hosts were happy to find touch and end proceedings at the end of a satisfying and deserved win for them. Wanderers will be disappointed not to have played to their full potential and to leave pointless.

One Wanderer who did play to his usual high standards was back-row forward, James Crompton who will depart shortly for a holiday in Australia. James has played in all of the firstteam games this season bar one when absent due to injury. He graduated in economics with a first-class honours degree from Loughborough University last year and will commence a career with one of the leading banks on his return from travelling.

Hat-Tricks of Hat-Tricks as Thanet Dominate at Gravesend

Thanet Wanderers Ladies travelled to Gravesend for their latest league fixture, facing windy weather conditions on an uneven pitch that made for an interesting challenge. However, the visitors adapted quickly, displaying outstanding teamwork and attacking flair to secure a commanding victory.

From the outset, Thanet asserted control. Receiving the kick-off, the forwards worked the ball through quick hands to Chloe Siddall, who found a gap in the defence. Alexandra White slotted the conversion, giving Thanet a strong lead.

The visitors were relentless, adding further tries from Lia Armstrong and Neave Evans before halftime. Great support play and quick recycling of possession saw Tabs Raymonde add another, rounding off a dominant first half with Thanet leading 46-0.

Second Half: Thanet Continue the Onslaught

With the slope advantage slightly shifting in the second half, Thanet showed no signs of slowing down. Alexandra White opened the half with a well-taken try under the posts, converting her own effort. Rachael Austerberry continued her try-scoring form, crossing twice more, with White maintaining her kicking accuracy.

Thanet's captain, Gee Cordell, delivered a spectacular solo effort, running from halfway, shrugging off tackles to score under the posts, with White adding the extras. The floodgates were well and truly open as Neave Evans completed her hat-trick with a barnstorming run, and Cordell followed suit with another impressive solo score. White remained clinical with the boot, converting both.

Izzy Lodge then added her name to the scoreboard, showcasing brilliant footwork to score near the posts. Holly Thurman-Newell rounded off the performance with a final try, converted by White, before the match was called early at 70 minutes, with Thanet sealing a 102-0 victory.

A chilly wet winter day saw Thanet Colts travel to Gravesend, playing on the first-team pitch, which offered a flat and decent surface in front of a good home crowd. Thanet were looking to bounce back, after a disappointing result last week. The match however started tentatively for Thanet, with Gravesend showing strong rucking and jackling skills frustrating the Thanet attack. Unfortunately, Thanet's penalty count again quickly spiralled like last week, with too many mistakes and a lack of communication between players. Their discipline was letting them down, as they repeatedly conceded penalties, failing to give the required 10-meter distance, which gave Gravesend an upper hand, without them having to play any better rugby.

Things took a turn for the worse when Will Gedge was yellow carded for accumulating too many penalties, leaving Thanet down to 14 men. Despite this, Thanet's backs began to show some good cohesion, with some nice passes beginning to develop promising moves. Durrant, and the Finleys began carrying the ball well. Ollie Davies, who had been solid in defence, made a lovely pass to James Murdock, who controlled the game well from fly-half. A smooth pass from Murdock, through Tom Gough on the loop put Jem Harris free, cutting through the middle in a try reminiscent of the Daley England try from the day before. Unfortunately, the conversion was missed (7-5).

The Thanet supporters expected this would open the flood gates but this was the final score of the match. Although Thanet showed some good moves and gained ground, they couldn't capitalize on their chances to score more points. There were missed opportunities that, in hindsight, could have turned the game around. The result was a frustrating one for Thanet, who should/could have secured a win in this friendly game away. Noah Bull sustained a broken nose and we wish him a speedy recovery.

Man of the Match was Zac Oliver Hendy, who stood out with an exceptional tackle count and powerful driving runs through the centre. His efforts were crucial in keeping Thanet competitive throughout the match.

Dominant performance sees Wanderers secure emphatic victory

Thanet Wanderers 2XV travelled to Medway expecting an Inner Warrior League triangular fixture with the hosts and Canvey Valkyries. However, with Medway only able to field six players, these were split between Thanet and Canvey, turning the game into a 13-a-side fixture played across three 20-minute thirds.

First Third

Thanet kicked off, and Canvey launched an early attack, but solid defensive work and a strong scrum win quickly shifted momentum. A brilliant break from Lia saw her score under the posts, though the conversion struck the bar.

Minutes later, Thanet's communication and width were effective, with Rebecca breaking through seven tackles before being brought down. Lia made good ground, supported by strong scrums and wellexecuted lineouts, with Sian carrying powerfully into contact. Thanet's dominance continued as Tabitha dipped and weaved through four defenders, scoring under the posts.

The defensive work remained strong, with solid tackles and well-organised scrums helping Thanet to regain possession. Quick hands from the backs created space out wide, allowing Thaseem—formerly of Thanet—to finish a flowing attack on the wing, with Tabitha adding the conversion.

Thanet finished the first period 22-0 ahead, showing a strong balance of attack and defence.

Second Third

After a quick break Thanet took to the field with renewed energy. With fresh legs coming on, the team looked to maintain their dominance. Canvey kicked off the second third, but a knockon led to a scrum. Thanet's pack put in a strong drive, contesting well, but the ball came out quickly for Canvey. A powerful hit from Tabitha halted their momentum, and moments later, Lia put in a key tackle to force a knock-on, handing possession back to Thanet. From the scrum, Thanet secured clean ball and moved it quickly through the hands. A wellplaced kick from Tabitha sent the ball deep into Canvey's territory, bouncing perfectly for Lia, who timed her run superbly to sprint through the defence and ground the ball under the posts.

The restart was scrappy, but Thanet reacted quickly, regaining possession through strong work at the breakdown. The forwards provided a solid platform, with Helen making key tackles and carrying powerfully, consistently driving the team forward. Thanet's dominance in the scrum and at the rucks allowed the backs to keep the momentum going, and Lia capitalised again, breaking through the defensive line to touch down for her second try of the third

With Thanet in full control, the forwards kept up their relentless work, contesting every breakdown and forcing turnovers. Vicky powered over in the corner after a well-structured attacking phase, rewarding the pack's efforts. Thanet continued to pile on the pressure, and with the defence stretched, Tabitha spotted a gap, darting through to claim her third try of the game. As the whistle blew for the final third, Thanet held a commanding 42-0 lead, with both the forwards and backs combining brilliantly to keep the team on the front foot.

Final Third

With further changes made, Thanet maintained their dominance, showing no signs of slowing down. The forwards continued to work tirelessly, securing possession and keeping the pressure on Canvey. Helen put in a relentless shift, consistently getting onto the ball, making powerful carries, and putting in crucial tackles to disrupt Canvey's attack. The defensive line held strong, with well-timed tackles and aggressive counter-rucking preventing the opposition from gaining any real ground.

Rebecca, who had been a standout throughout the game, was constantly in the right place

at the right time, working across the pitch and driving play forward. After a period of sustained pressure and quick recycling from the breakdown, Thanet were awarded a penalty. A quick tap-and-go saw the ball passed to Rebecca, who powered through the defensive line to score Thanet's final try, sealing a dominant performance

Canvey fought to respond, but Thanet's defensive structure remained solid, forcing handling errors and turnovers. The backs worked well to clear danger, with quick hands and intelligent kicking keeping Canvey pinned in their own half. As the final whistle blew, Thanet celebrated a 47-0 victory—an emphatic display of teamwork, determination, and attacking flair

MATCH REPORT

THANET WANDERERS 24 - 43 OLD ALLEYNIANS

Wanderers late comeback cannot prevent an Alleynians' victory

Thanet's Charlie Bailey was unwell and Finn White is no longer available but otherwise, most Wanderers supporters will have been happy with the selectors' choice. The away fixture ended in a win by one point for Wanderers so a good game was in prospect.

It was a very pleasant afternoon for rugby with sunshine and a gentle breeze up the slope. OAs were quickly on the attack in Wanderers' half and the hosts appeared to have contained the threat before a single missed tackle allowed OAs an easy trip to the posts. 7-0 to the visitors with barely two minutes played. A penalty for a high tackle set Wanderers 15 metres out but the attack fizzled out against strong defending. A further penalty didn't reach touch near the clubhouse and OAs, smartly passed their way to an overlap on their left and again there was an untroubled run in under the posts. 14-0 to the visitors with 11 minutes played. A well-worked line-out followed Adam Harrison's long penalty and Nick Herbert was away before handing on to Lewis Downer who also made good ground before being hauled down close to the line. Ben Cannon picked up at the breakdown and powered over in the corner. The powerful Number 8 has been in Thailand since early December and his return was a welcome bonus for Wanderers. So was Downer's fine conversion from the left touch line with Thanet now 14-7 down. OAs continued to press and Mirams' big clearance brought welcome relief but moments later a penalty about 30 metres out was slotted by OAs to extend their lead. Harrison's big tackle slowed an attack from a big runner in OAs backline but with half-time near an individual try further extended their lead. In the final play of the half, some uncertain Wanderers' defence allowed OAs to burst through the line to touch down close to the posts. The conversion made the halftime score 29-7 to the visitors.

Finley Hickmott was on for the second half where he was joined by Marius Thompson who

had been a reluctant spectator with injury and surgery for sixteen months. Right wing Andrew Dolan thought he was clear after an interception only to be recalled when the referee blew for an earlier infringement. The opening 19 minutes of the second half were competitive but without score, until the visitors broke the deadlock with two converted tries in the space of five minutes to lead 43-7. With pride and perhaps a try bonus point to play for, Wanderers soon scored with a try for Dolan after a series of wide passes following a turnover from the pack. No Conversion but with ten minutes to play, a bonus point was the target. The third try came from Cannon on halfway who caught a goal line drop out and was near to touching down when tackled. Finally, the ball was spun right and Downer touched down. He was unable to convert with a drop kick but with minutes remaining a fourth try was possible. It came from a good build-up initiated by Thompson who took play into OAs half before the ball was hurried along the line to Cannon on the left near the opposition ten metre line. He made straight for the line before going for the posts, once in the in-goal area. Downer converted leaving the final score at 43 -24 to Alleynians.

The Dulwich-based side is the backup XV for the first XV who now play in Regional One. Today's half-back pairing played for the Club in their match against London Welsh in early January. Certainly, some of the handling in this game was of a consistently higher standard than any other side has produced this year at St Peters. They were worthy winners today and the win moves them up to fourth place in Kent 2 with a game in hand so they will clearly be a factor in the run-in to the season's end. There is no game for Wanderers next Saturday: they return to action on the 15th of February with an away match against Aylesford when kick-off time will again be 2 PM. Only five league fixtures remain, please support the team during their five-match run-in.


