It's been a busy and exciting start to the 2025/26 season both on and off the field, with genuine progress being made across all sections of the club. Our focus remains clear — building a true “One Club” culture where every player, coach, volunteer, and supporter feels part of the same journey.

Over the summer we made key structural changes that have already started to bear fruit:

2. Senior Rugby – Building Momentum

The 1st XV have shown impressive intent early in Counties 2 Kent. After a challenging previous season, the squad has rebuilt around energy, cohesion, and accountability.

Recent Results:

- Win vs Sidcup II – 34-18
- Win vs Beckenham II – 31-10
- Loss vs Tonbridge Juddians II – 22-43

The Tonbridge result was a reminder of the fine margins in this league — strong phases and attacking intent were clear, but we must maintain consistency for the full 80 minutes. The set-piece remains a platform, and our “Skull” defensive system is fast becoming a club identity.

The 2nd XV continue to provide competitive rugby for developing players, with several

strong showings in recent weeks. The pathway between 2s and 1s is now clearer than ever, ensuring everyone understands their route to higher-level rugby.

3. Women's Rugby – Continued Growth

The Women's 1st XV are setting high standards on and off the field, with excellent wins against Ashford and Beckenham.

The squad continues to grow, welcoming new players each month and fostering a brilliant team culture. Credit goes to the leadership and coaching group for maintaining the perfect balance of enjoyment and ambition.

4. Colts and Player Development Pathway

A huge milestone for the club this month is the formal launch of the Thanet Wanderers Player Development Pathway— a clear, structured route from U6 through to senior rugby, designed to ensure every player understands their next step.

To lead this, we are delighted to announce Kieran Hopper as our new Pathway Development Officer.

Kieran will oversee:

- Transition of Colts into senior rugby
- Development of the Girls' Pathway and SEND inclusion programme

Kieran's enthusiasm, professionalism, and deep connection with the club make him the perfect person for this role. His appointment marks another step toward our long-term goal — a unified, transparent, and aspirational player journey across Thanet Wanderers.

MATCH REPORT

TONBRIDGE JUDDIANS II 43 - 22 THANET WANDERERS

Thanet Wanderers suffered their first defeat of the season away at Tonbridge Juddians II in what was a far closer contest than the final score suggests. The 43-22 result slightly flatters the home side, with Thanet pushing hard for much of the match and showing real determination throughout.

Thanet were backed by fantastic travelling support for the long trip to Judds. That journey was made even longer by a walk past several better pitches to reach a less-than-ideal playing surface half a mile from the clubhouse.

There were three changes to the Thanet starting XV: Browning came in at prop, Clement started at hooker, and Hickmott made his first appearance of the season at flanker. Letts was also a surprise inclusion, having become available thanks to the EU.

First Half: Strong Response

Thanet kicked off, but it was Judds who made the brighter start, using their speedy backline to stretch play wide at every opportunity. After some slick handling, their powerful prop crashed over for a converted try, giving them an early 7-0 lead.

Thanet responded immediately. After several well-worked phases involving both forwards and backs, a driving maul was set up, and Cannon powered over for his eighth try of the season. The conversion went wide, but Thanet were on the board at 7-5.

Judds hit back quickly, with their fullback making a dangerous break before the forwards finished the move with another converted try to extend their lead to 14-5.

Thanet weren't rattled. Some impressive interplay between backs and forwards – including a highlight-reel offload from Herbert – opened up space for Thompson to score in the corner. Walton nailed the touchline conversion to bring the score to 14-12.

Thanet continued to pile on the pressure and were rewarded when Herbert hit a hard line off

a short ball to crash over for another try. The conversion looked good, but a disagreement between the touch judges led to it being ruled out, leaving Thanet 14-17 up at halftime after an excellent comeback.

Second Half: Game Slips Away Late

Judds came out strong after the break, scoring two quick converted tries through their backs to regain control at 28-17.

A controversial penalty against Thanet for holding on – just as it looked like they had turned the ball over – led to a successful Judds penalty kick, stretching the lead to 31-17.

Thanet weren't done. Sustained pressure in the Judds half led to a brilliant individual effort from Walton, who broke the line from a ruck, chipped over the last man, and won the foot race to touch down. The conversion was missed, but at 31-22 with 10 minutes to play, it was game on.

However, a speculative pass in attack was intercepted, and Judds capitalised with a sweeping counterattack for another converted try, making it 38-22.

Thanet kept fighting, pinning Judds in their 22, but a well-executed move from a scrum allowed Judds to cross once more. Surprisingly, their usually reliable fullback missed the conversion, bringing the final score to 43-22.

Final Thoughts

For 70 minutes, Thanet matched a very strong Judds side, playing some impressive rugby with solid set-piece work and effective interplay between backs and forwards. They scored four tries to secure a bonus point, but a few missed chances and small errors proved costly in the closing stages.

Despite the result, Thanet remain top of the league by a single point, though they have played one more game than second-placed Tonbridge Juddians II.

MATCH REPORT

Thanet make it four bonus point wins in a row with a strong performance against Beckenham's 2nd XVI

Thanet made it four consecutive bonus point wins with a dominant performance over Beckenham 2nds, showcasing excellent teamwork, solid defence, and some thrilling tries.

There were a few changes to the line-up for this fixture: Mirams returned at fullback, McCourt-Welsh slotted in at prop, and Riddell-Broomfield made his first appearance of the season on the flank.

Beckenham started strongly, applying early pressure, but a crucial line-out steal by Long allowed Thanet to clear their lines and push into the opposition's 22. Good interplay between forwards and backs earned a penalty, which was kicked to the corner. A promising catch-and-drive followed, but strong Beckenham defence forced a turnover, and they cleared their lines.

Playing uphill, Beckenham tried to relieve pressure with a deep kick, but Thanet responded well and earned another penalty, again kicked to the corner. Another catch-and-drive had the line at their mercy, but the ball was unfortunately spilled, allowing Beckenham to escape.

In a moment of danger, Beckenham launched a superb counter-attack from their own 22, with their forwards and backs combining beautifully. Fortunately for Thanet, their winger kicked ahead with the line in sight, and a desperate last-ditch challenge led to a Beckenham penalty. Thanet stole the ensuing line-out and cleared their lines once more.

Thanet continued to apply pressure. Smart link-up play created space for Thompson, resulting in a drop-out on the Beckenham try line. Thanet kept them pinned inside their 22, and after several pick-and-goes from the forwards, Walton sniped over in the corner to open the scoring: 5-0.

Beckenham responded immediately from the restart, earning a penalty which they slotted to make it 5-3.

Thanet continued their dominance, and a flowing move saw the ball moved left through

the backs. Thompson showed great footwork to beat the defence and score, with Walton adding the extras: 12-3 at half-time — a scoreline that didn't quite reflect Thanet's control, especially playing downhill.

The second half started perfectly for Thanet. Strong defence forced a Beckenham spill from the kick-off. Thompson fly-hacked the loose ball forward, recovered it, and was driven over for his second try. Walton nailed a tough conversion to extend the lead to 19-3.

Thanet continued to press, with Cannon making some powerful runs. Another promising move saw the ball go wide again, with Thompson heading for the corner before popping the ball inside to Mills, who crossed the line — only for the try to be controversially ruled out by the touch judge.

Beckenham, attacking down the slope, knocked on again under pressure. Walton pounced, weaving through defenders to score a superb individual try in the corner: 24-3 (conversion missed).

Beckenham fought back, scoring a converted try after several strong carries from their forwards before spreading it wide to their backs: 24-10.

Thanet had the final say. After another sustained attack, they earned a line-out in Beckenham's 22. A perfectly executed catch-and-drive from the 22-metre line saw the forwards power over with Smith scoring the try and Walton converting to seal the win: 31-10.

This was an all-round impressive performance from Thanet, with sharp defence, clinical attack, and an outstanding set-piece. The forward coaches in particular will have enjoyed the dominance up front.

Coaches' Man of the Match was Giotto McCourt-Welsh for his powerful scrummaging and dynamic ball carrying.

Their technical level is excellent and they’ve fully bought into the approach — a real credit to the club’s youth coaching. We’ve notched a couple of maul tries already and that’s an area we’ll keep working on as we move into the classic English winter conditions!

Off the pitch, Elliot, Warren and the other team leaders are doing a brilliant job in building a strong culture and sense of community. It’s awesome being able to bring my three kids (Hattie, Edie and Brody) up to the club after home games and letting them have a spin on the fine wheel, though apologies if you’re trying to enjoy a quiet pint and find them crawling under your table!

MATCH REPORT
